Report: DDMBA President (Mark Raftus)

DDMBA had a fantastic season overall! With Covid-19 finally abating **registration soared** from pandemic levels in 2020-2021 of 713 and 973 participants respectfully to a new DDMBA record of 1197 registered participants. A normal season of baseball was able to be played with a full, robust **Recreation side** with thirty-two Recreation teams playing between the U11, U13, U15 and U18 levels. On the **Competitive side** there were fifteen A, AA and AAA teams combined with the Arrows fielding AA and AAA teams at U11, U13, U15 and U18 levels and A teams at U15 and U18 levels. As well, Associations Clubs fielded A level teams at 11, 13 and 15 levels. Registration continued to be strong at the introductory ages of U5, U7 and U9 levels which is a great sign for years to come.

League winners were crowned at all Recreation levels behind the guidance of Recreation Coordinator Dominique Surette-Lombard. Diamond Dawgs also won the inaugural City championship at the U15 level. The Competitive level was under Brian Secord's purview. Several Arrows teams won provincial titles including at the U13AAA, U15AAA and U18AA levels. The U15AAA team also won the Atlantic Championships and were named Baseball NS team of the year. The U18AA team hosted a successful Atlantic Championship tournament at Beazley field.

DDMBA was blessed with an **excellent Executive and Board in 2022**. Each member performed their role at a very high level and were very responsive to issues and inquiries from membership. A new website called RAMP was installed to replace Goalline and it was integrated with Baseball NS. Special thanks to DDMBA VP Darren Hunter who was instrumental in overseeing the installation of it and troubleshooting issues which arose. Without his presence we would be at least a year behind where we are right now.

At the outset of 2022 season Executive meetings, a goal was stated to update the **Coaches Manual & Practice Plan and hold a pre-season coaches' meeting** to review them along with the Recreation and Competitive Rules to better prepare coaches for the season to come. Approximately 50 coaches attended the meeting which was chaired by the President and Recreation Co-ordinator Dominique Surette-Lombard. All questions were answered, and the playoff format revealed with a commitment to enforce the Recreation Rules as written for the full season to stay consistent and clear. That commitment was carried out and although the season was typically busy as is the norm for close to 800 Recreation members the season ran smoothly overall. Some playoff tweaks for the older age groups will take place in 2023 but not many are needed.

From a **Discipline standpoint**, the President chaired the Discipline Committee with Secretary Donnie MacDonald & Brian Moore of Diamond Dawgs. Only two incidents requiring suspension

arose all season which was a testament to the organization provided by Co-ordinators, Club Presidents, and coaches.

From a **Safety standpoint**, the Criminal Record Check policy and current system of compliance predominantly used myBackCheck. It was noted the compliance aspect was very labour intensive to administer by the President with assistance from the Clubs. A new system will be addressed for next season. As now it stands Baseball NS is surveying a request from the province to monitor compliance and establish a central repository of Record Checks for all HRM clubs to access.

From a **Public Relations standpoint** media inquiries were fielded by the President and various Arrows coaches resulting in online articles authored by local sports reporters and some TV media related to coaches giving back to their community. A successful Junior Nationals tournament was also held in August in which many DDMBA players/parents took part as ball boys, ball chasers and volunteers of varying types.

Field Conditions remain an issue. Although HRM poured resources into making Big Beazley ballfield a showcase field with new lights, stands and bullpens their satellite fields of Kinsman and Little Beazley require work. Further, overall day-to-day field conditions at other DDMBA fields remain an issue. A committee will be struck to address these issues. The Beazley bullpen was rejuvenated through DDMBA efforts. A small user fee will be instituted for next season to defray ongoing maintenance costs.

The Executive/Board would like to thank all the coaches, managers, treasurers and volunteers for their efforts throughout the season. I would also like to extend a personal thank you to the Club Presidents who are stepping back from their roles within their organizations including Jamie Aalders of Cole Harbour, Chris Cluett of Diamond Dawgs, Lorri Arnold of Porters Lake and Albert Sarracini of Humber Park. Your efforts have been greatly appreciated and have not gone unnoticed. You have left your organizations in a better position than they were in when you started. New leadership will be elected at each Club's AGM to come.

As per **Article 5.2 of the DDMBA Constitution** each Executive Member serves a one-year term. Each position is therefore up for election under the current Constitution, but the following positions have incumbents who have advised they wish to return for the 2023 season:

Report: DDMBA Registrar (Jim Scott)


Registered almost 1,200 kids this year!

Special thanks to Darren for his work on getting RAMP up and running. Realistically without his work we would be looking at rolling the system out going over this coming winter. RAMP was a major upgrade from Goalline, time to processing payments was much less and reporting from a registration perspective was much better. We have some items to revisit over the winter but overall, a successful launch.

Below is a historical breakdown of DDMBA registration, this year numbers exceeds recent precovid numbers that peaks from 2018.




Total registration fees with Clinics and Tournaments exceeded quarter of a million dollars!

Major items of note:

Credit Card costs, ~\$4,600, large increase over prior years. Driving that change is 1) increased volume 2) greater shift towards credit card usage (assumably because of ease of processing in RAMP).

Rates in RAMP are lower than in Goalline, at old rates CC costs have been ~\$800 more.



Total IT systems costs this year were \$3,738, much of that was one time transition related. Go forward fixed cost with RAMP will be in the \$1k range, with optional Team app costs (about \$30 team).

Bank account have been changed to unlimited electronic transactions at marginal additional fixed cost, should save several hundred dollars annually.

Uncollected amounts, 3% of registration fees are uncollected. This is an area that should be looked at, RAMP tracks this and users will see the balance owing next year if/when they register.

Report: Competitive Coordinator (Brian Secord)

- Competitive Tryouts:
 - 234 players attended tryouts.
 - One Last Rep was used to do the initial skills evaluation before getting on the field. It went very well, and the results helped with the selection of the teams.
 - After using OLR and seeing what the results were, there will be some changes in the on-field evaluation process next year.
 - As with any year there were lessons learned by all and some changes will be made again for next year.
 - o There were 10 Arrow's teams again this year.
- All but one team received new jerseys this year. They didn't get them because we ran
 out of the sizes that they needed. More of these sizes will be ordered so everyone will
 be in the same jerseys next year.
- Some of the note worthy team results are:
 - o 11U AA won their league.
 - 11U AAA second in Provincials.
 - o 13U AAA won Provincials.
 - 15U AAA won Provincials and Atlantic's. Also named team of the year by BNS.
 - o 18U AA won Provincials and finished 3rd in Atlantic's.
- We ran winter camps at OLR for all age groups that went for 8 weeks. We will be running the again this winter in the new year.
- Repairs were made to the Beazley Batting Cages. With the repairs and construction completed at Beazley, we should get more use out of next year.

Report: Recreation Coordinator (Dominique Surette-Lombard)

It was a busy season...

- Did an overhaul of the DDMBA "Rules of play" so that there were not multiple different rules to follow for each level.
- A Coaches meeting was held on June 5th, at Cole Harbour Place to go over the 2022 Coaches Manuel.
- There were 30 teams from U11-U18 each having approximately 20 regular season games.
- There were quite a few Forfeits. Rainouts, and canceled games that were not made up.
- For the most part, Playoffs went well except for U11 as many of the rules were not being properly followed.

Report: Diamond Dawgs President (Chris Cluett)

The Diamond Dawgs 2022 season was a success as registration was back to pre-covid numbers. Registration at U18 was not what we expected as many players left the sport after their final year of U15, however our U5 and U7 registration was the best it has been in years which is encouraging for the future. Early in the season we struggled to find enough volunteers for all teams in U11 and U13 however the volunteers that we had, once again did a great job and made us proud.

The Diamond Dawgs incorporated the Jays Rally Cap program into our U5 and U7 age groups this year. Even with the lack of support from BNS for this program, the inaugural year went well, and we have identified areas that we will continue to improve over the coming years.

This year the Diamond Dawgs added the Challenger program to our offering. This was the most successful and rewarding addition we have made to date. We had over 20 players registered in this our first season. We were honored to be asked to host a Jays Care Workshop on the recently renovated Woodlawn Fields. The players and volunteers were lucky to get to spend a couple of hours with the Jays Care Challenger team which included Matt Stairs that played with the Blue Jays in 2007-2008.

We once again added to our infrastructure and improved city facilities for our players. This year we added a batting cage, dual bullpen, and storage locker at the Woodside fields. DDMBA Constitution Amendments (Mark Raftus)

Article 5 – The Executive

Article 5.2

Current wording:

The executive shall consist of President, Vice President, Secretary, Registrar, Treasurer, Competitive Coordinator, Recreation Coordinator & 3 House Program coordinators. All to be elected at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) & serve a 1-year term. Each member of the Executive shall have one (1) vote in all matters requiring voting.

Proposed new wording:

The Executive shall consist of President, Vice President, Secretary, Registrar, Treasurer, Competitive Coordinator and Recreation Coordinator. All to be elected at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) and serve a two [2] year term. To preserve stability on the Executive, the positions of President, Secretary & Competitive Co-ordinator should be voted on in even numbered years and the positions of Vice-President, Registrar, Treasurer and Recreation Coordinator should be voted on in odd numbered years. If this system is not possible due to circumstances of an Executive Member withdrawing from the role, the position[s] at issue may be elected in any year to ensure the Executive position is filled. Each member of the Executive shall have one (1) vote in all matters requiring voting.

Changes:

Remove the three house program co-ordinators, make the Executive terms two years, and propose an every-other-year vote for various positions to ensure stability of Executive personnel.

Article 10 - The Treasurer

Addition of new Article 10.5 stating:

The Treasurer position is a stipend eligible position with the stipend to be paid at the conclusion of the season with the sum to be set by the Executive and Board of Directors each season. Sum to be set prior to season and paid at season end.

Article 11 – Program Co-Ordinators

Article 11.1

Current wording:

Recreational Coordinators shall be responsible for organizing schedules and providing this information to the Secretary prior to the season starting.

Proposed new wording:

The Recreation Coordinator shall be responsible for organizing schedules and providing this information to the Secretary prior to the season and/or playoffs starting.

Changes:

Refining the existing language and specific stated inclusion of the playoff's schedules to the Recreation Coordinator role.

Addition of new Article 11.1A stating:

The Recreation Coordinator position is a stipend eligible position with the stipend to be paid at the conclusion of the season with the sum to be set by the Executive and Board of Directors each season. Sum to be set prior to season and paid at season end.

Article 13 - Umpires

Article 13.1

Current wording:

The Board of Directors shall annually endorse the Umpire-in-chief and the Umpires assigning Officer for the Dartmouth Region. The assignor is approved by DDMBA each year and works for DDMBA and its member associations.

Proposed new wording:

The Board of Directors shall annually endorse the Umpire-In-Chief and select the DDMBA Umpires Assigning Officer. The DDMBA Umpires Assigning Officer is approved by DDMBA each year and works for DDMBA and its member associations. The Umpires Assigning Officer position is a stipend eligible position with the stipend to be paid at the conclusion of the season with the sum to be set by the Executive and Board of Directors each season.

Changes:

Refine the wording of the existing paragraph and add the section on stipend eligibility.
