6.2 Lloydminster U13A team Playing U15

Discussion had regarding the U13A team playing up in U15 division. Justin advised the team did well and was looking for

opinions on what other teams thought. Lloydminster happy and thought it was beneficial. Keeps girls playing girls hockey. Close games at end of year. Ended up second in league. No issues as advised from JodyAnn, U15 Govenor. There were some strength concerns. U15 is more aggressive and faster. Some Lloydminster parents were upset, but need to understand that their kids are moving up in the league, they need to expect that in playing up a level. Regarding Provincials, Chad did discuss with Hockey Alberta prior to the girls moving up if they could still participate in Provincials. Was told yes, A Provincials. When it came time, Hockey Alberta changed their decision and said no. Parents and girls were upset. Not a league thing, it was Hockey Alberta. League to help next year and discuss with Hockey Alberta.

## 6.3 U11 Playoff Tournament

Mike, U11 Govenor advised that Chad Oborowsky put on a great tournament. Ended up doing 2 tournaments. Lloydminster teams did round robin and point system. And the other teams did double elimination, guaranteed 2 games. Most teams got 3 games. Overall tournaments went ok, tough situation with Lloydminster having stronger teams. Scheduling nightmare, but worked out. Other teams had fun and enjoyed. Shayna mentioned the cost was difficult as no other teams had fees for playoffs. The team had to come up with the money. Inquired if bids could be put in and teams to be let known upfront the costs so they can budget for it? Or at registration each team pays extra to give to host team at end? Tough as not all associations will know the teams in advance. Teams will just have to budget and know that there will be a year end fee. Discussion had on format. What's best for the league? Top 4 / Bottom 4? Hard to have a tournament structure and won't know until after Christmas the calibre of teams. Possibly have different scenarios done up? There will always be stronger teams. Decided that Govenors / Executive will "decide on the fly" and make the decision. No need for change to bylaws. It is possible that every age division will be a league tournament next year, if mandated by Hockey Alberta.

Motion made by Bryce: Throughout each playoff round, the team that finished with a higher seeding in regular season will maintain the higher seeding in each sub-sequent found of playoffs, and match ups will be determined by their respective rankings. (highest VS Lowest) - SEE BELOW.

In best of 3 games. 2 game total points until final round. Bring forward at Fall Meeting. Discussion had on the 10 goal mercy rule and wording. Applies to both teams whether you play or not. Wording will be changed at Fall Meeting.

13.5.4 Special conditions for Ft. Mac in playoffs (top seed home advantage for both games - reduce travelling as it may not be realistic in some scenarios)

Discussion had on how to move forward with playoffs for Fort McMurray only. Decision made after discussion that the highest seeded community hosts the first 2 games. Host team to take care of ice fees, refs, etc. If game 3 required, it will then move to the lower seed team location.

13.5.5 U15 possibly end season one week early as currently there is only one week to accommodate final best of three series - may not be realistic in some cases.

U15 provincials are usually a week before U13 and U18. League will end one week early as to allow for 2 weekends to do the final round. Not taking games away, just condensing season.
