PROGRAMMING PARTNERSHIPS: ALBERTA ROUNDNET



- 2023 EUPA continued on a collaboration with Alberta Roundnet to offer spike ball programming adjacent to our indoor programming
- This proved to be mutually beneficial to both organizations as it allowed EUPA to recoup the cost of partial vacant field space and for Alberta Roundnet to obtain bookings at facilities that they would have a hard time otherwise securing



TOURNAMENTS

- EUPA was able to run local adult tourna
 - Holiday Hat Huckfest 2022 attended by 28 spirited players.
 for KidSport! 2023 Holiday Hat Huckfest Registration is open now!
 - **Frostbite** played by 10 teams scheduling difficulties with CCRC, had reduced playing time; Glad to have full 6 hours returned for Frostbite 2024
 - **A4UC** played by 10 teams, awarded C4UC bids to the top 3 teams.
 - **Spirit of Summer & CUPS** cancelled due to lack of participants. Will re-evaluate a summer tournament in 2025.

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2023 - Treasurer's Comments

- Income from adult programming was static year over year. Revenue was up but so were expenses (primarily indoor field costs).
- EUPA increased its summer league fees in 2023, leading to roughly \$ 6,900.00 in additional summer profit.
- Despite no longer partnering with AFC on fundraising leagues, our fundraising/outreach efforts netted a small profit of 294.00, while also allowing us to retain fields for future growth.
- We had significant success in applying for grants in the 2023 fiscal year. Our grant revenue increased by 40,250.00. Unfortunately, we have now exhausted many of the grants available for our youth program, and we will have to pursue alternative funding sources.
- This year we implemented an operational reserve policy equal to six months of operational costs.
- One of our primary Organizational goals is to grow our youth program to sustainability. This means that we expect to incur significant operational losses over the next few years. In the meantime, our cash position remains strong, and we are able to address unexpected costs effectively.

- Promo codes: Primarily used in Player Accommodations, Student Discounts and Femme+ Discounts. Our newly introduced LAP program has been underutilized.
- Redeemed account credits: Primarily Ambassador registrations, Staff Discounts, and Refunds.

The motion will be decided by a majority of the votes after seven (7) days. A non-vote is recorded as an abstain. In the case of an equality of votes, the President shall have a second or casting vote. All electronic motions and vote results shall be summarized and entered into records.

ARTICLE IV. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

4.15 - ELECTRONIC VOTES.

The board shall establish a policy to guide electronic votes. In the case of an equality of votes, the President shall have a second or casting vote. All electronic motions and vote results shall be summarized and entered into records.



ARTICLE IX. MEETINGS OF THE MEMBERS

9.07 - VOTING AND VOTES TO GOVERN. Any voting member who has not withdrawn from membership or whose membership has not been suspended or cancelled as herein provided shall have the right to vote at any meeting of the members. A financial statement shall be prepared annually and duly audited by the auditor or auditors of the Association and such audited financial statement duly signed by the President and Treasurer and accompanied by a written signed report of the auditor shall be placed before the members at the next annual meeting of the members of the Association. The remuneration of the auditor shall be subject to the approval of the directors.
