SMOKING, URINATION AND ALCOHOL POLICY

The following list is not tolerated at any FCR sanctioned league games:

- PLAYERS URINATING ON THE BERMS AT LEIBEL FIELD
- PLAYERS URINATING ON THE ARTIFICIAL TURF AT LEIBEL FIELD
- PLAYERS SMOKING AT THE PLAYER'S BENCH BETWEEN SHIFTS
- PLAYERS LIGHTING UP AS THEY CROSS THE FIELD ON THE WAY TO THEIR CARS
- PLAYERS & SPECTATORS CONSUMING ALCOHOL IN THEIR VEHICLES
- PLAYERS DISCARDING EMPTIES AND GARBAGE IN THE PARKING AREA
- PUBLIC URINATION AT ALL SOCCER FIELDS

Any Player, Team Official, Affiliated Player or Guest Player identified or unidentified as a member of a particular team who is observed urinating on the playing surface or any adjacent area at any fields (berms or surrounding field area) operated by the City of Regina or University of Regina fields will be forwarded to the FCR Discipline Committee and subject to discipline for the player and/or team as per the FCR Discipline Code.

Any Player, Team Official, Affiliated Player or Guest Player identified or unidentified as a member of a particular team who is observed smoking on the playing surface or any adjacent area at any fields (berms or surrounding field area) operated by the City of Regina or University of Regina fields will be forwarded to the FCR Discipline Committee and subject to discipline for the player and/or team as per the FCR Discipline Code.

City of Regina Bylaw 10167 (in regard to smoking) must be observed within the playing and spectator areas. Non-Compliance is punishable by fines up to \$2,000.00. Smoking is restricted to the parking lots only.

Any Player, Team Official, Affiliated Player or Guest Player identified or unidentified as a member of a particular team who is observed with open liquor in a motor vehicle or consumption of alcohol in a motor vehicle or on the City of Regina property (fields and surrounding area) or University of Regina fields will be forwarded to the FCR Discipline Committee and subject to discipline for the player and/or team as per the FCR Discipline Code. Open alcohol incidents will also be reported to the Regina Police Service.
