We are committed to providing an environment free of discrimination and bias, where everyone has an opportunity to maximize their potential, fully participate in creating success and where each person is valued, respected and supported for their attributes, skills and experience.

The diversity of our membership includes factors such as race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, socio-economic status, culture, age, physical ability, education, language, skill levels, family status, religious, political and other beliefs and personal styles.
