# GAME DAY PROGRAM



Edmonton, Alberta, Canada is the heartland of football in Canada and is the perfect choice for Football Canada to host the 2023 Football Canada Cup. Alberta's Capital became a city in 1906 and over the past 118 years has grown into a major metropolitan region with over 1,000,000 residents.

Edmonton proudly recognizes that it is located on Treaty Six land and fully respects the Indigenous heritage of all the first nations that enriches its culture every day. It is also home to a broad spectrum of cultures, beliefs, and creeds that annually thrive on display in the largest Heritage Days celebration in the nation each August.

Alberta's Capital City also has a long and proud tradition of hosting major sporting events. Starting most notably in 1978 with the Commonwealth Games, Edmonton has also hosted the 1983 World Universiade Games, the 2001 World Track and Field Championship, and portions of the 2002 FIFA U19 Women's World Cup and 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup. In each situation the events drew huge crowds, rave reviews and the host organization set the bar for future events.

As for football, the Edmonton area boasts the CFL's Edmonton Elks; the University of Alberta Golden Bears and is the only city in Canada boasting two Junior teams in the CJFL. The City and the Elks have hosted Grey Cups on five occasions and always set a new standard for the delivery of the game and have had four of the five highest attended events since 1997. 2018's Grey Cup festival reached 430,967 people (including the sellout crowd of 55,819 who attended the game) and had a 93% positive impact rating by Edmontonians surveyed after the game.



In short, all those things listed above combined show you that Edmonton is a diverse community that knows how to host things and host things well. Its football history and fan support will make it perfect for Football Canada Cup

#### **FOOTBALL ALBERTA:**



Football Alberta is the Provincial Governing Body for the sport of football in the province and will be the host organization of this event. Incorporated as a non-profit association under the Societies Act of Alberta in 1973 it grew out of the Northern and Southern Alberta Coaches Associations that formed in the 1950's. Membership in Football Alberta has grown through the years to incorporate close to 20,000 paid and associate members and we annually vie to be the largest representative member of Football Canada.

Our Association runs several provincial events each year and has hosted four previous Football Canada Cups and two Western U16 Challenges since 1996 and each time were successful and ran an event that set the bar for the next ones. Our ability to host events plus the size of our paid and committed membership and supportive communities make us more than confident we can run an elite event worthy of a national championship.

## Game and Practice Venues:

### COMMONWEALTH STADIUM (11000 Stadium Road NW)



The feature stadium for the final day of competition on July 15 will be Commonwealth Stadium. With its seating for 55,000 and infrastructure that can handle Grey Cups, it is the only facility in town that can handle more than 5000 spectators and is located on the LRT line for ease of transportation. It is the hope of the organizing committee to have TSN broadcasting or streaming the Gold Medal game so Commonwealth.

### FOOTE FIELD (11601 – 68 Avenue NW)

The home field of the University of Alberta Golden Bears Football Team with four dressing rooms, seating for 3000, full spotters' box and artificial turf. It is located on the LRT Line a five-minute ride from the dorms and will be easily accessed by teams for practice and games on July 9 and July 12.



### **JASPER PLACE BOWL (9170 – 163 Street NW)**

A beautiful facility in west Edmonton, newly refurbished in 2021, and with a brand-new artificial turf. It will be used for practice only and it is the only facility not on the LRT line which will mean bussing for teams scheduled there on practice days. It is a 15-minute ride from the dorms one way.

## **Social and Community**


**Sports Facts** – Football Alberta currently has over 20,000 members with about 7,000 coming from the Metro Edmonton region. The numbers for tackle football have been consistent over the past decade but the numbers of participants in non-contact youth flag have tripled in recent years. The creation of the Edmonton Junior High School Flag Football League in 2017 featuring competition for both genders at over 30 Junior High's is a perfect example of that. Going forward, we expect more growth at the non-contact level and a continued expansion of programming for girls and women in tackle football.

**Sport and Social Development** – Two initiatives we would partake in on other fronts would be:

- **The Green Games** – with less carbon footprint than any event before, Football Alberta will implement most of the participant transportation by utilizing the City of Edmonton LRT. In every aspect of this event Football Alberta would look to set the standard for future events both hosted in Edmonton and through Football Canada for as much of a carbon neutral experience as possible.
- **Indigenous All-Star Game** – The event will host an exhibition Indigenous All-Star Game between Alberta and Saskatchewan. The age level would be high school kids roughly similar to the U18 nature of the Football Canada Cup. Football Alberta is working with Football Saskatchewan and the Indigenous Sport Council of Alberta to achieve this. This game will occur on Friday, July 14 of the event.

## **EVENT HISTORY**

The history of the Football Canada Cup is full of the thrills of victory, agony of defeat, and some unfortunate controversy. As it has evolved from a 19 and Under, to a U19, to a U19 and U17, and finally to a U18 format the concept of anything can happen once the ball is kicked off has remained consistent. Nowhere was that more evident than in the first official Championship game held in McGill Stadium on July 15, 1995.

The origins of the Football Canada Cup can be traced back well into the 1960's when the delegates of the then Canadian Amateur Football Association (the precursor to Football Canada) proposed the "Little Grey Cup" which was a National Midget Championship. Since most provinces had High School football rather than Midget the event never really took off nationally, but a proposal to form Provincial Teams to compete in a national tournament was born to replace the club team championship.

Still, it took two decades before any movement towards that concept took place. In 1990, Nova Scotia offered to host a National Provincial Team Championship that attracted teams from Ontario, Quebec, and New Brunswick. In 1991 the first interprovincial game between Alberta and Manitoba provincial teams took place. In 1993 a test National Championship operated by Football Canada named the Merritt Cup (after the first President of CAFA) was held in July in Calgary and featured four teams from Alberta, B.C., Manitoba, and Quebec. The event was a success and featured an outstanding final where Quebec outdueled a feisty B.C. team, led by slotbacks Bret Anderson (future B.C. Lion) and Jerome Pathon (future Indianapolis Colt), 38-32.

Then...nothing. 1994 came and went with just a few interprovincial games being played but nothing on the national stage and it appeared that the concept of a true National Provincial Team Championship was dead and gone. Then like a whirlwind, federal funding came through and a deal with Air Canada was struck and the first official Football Canada Cup was scheduled for July 1995. The first order of business was to officially name it the Football Canada Cup. With all due respect to Mr. Merritt's descendants and the quaint Canadian habit we have of naming events and trophies after people (i.e. Grey, Vanier, Stanley, etc.), the decision was made to name the event after the association and the name and its abbreviation (FCC) has stuck ever since.

As the host province we are proud to be the first team to win the Football Canada Cup in 1995 with a 10-6 victory over Quebec at McGill Stadium and have since repeated that for a total of 6 having won in 1995, 1997, 1998, 2000, 2001 and 2007. It has been a bit of a dry spell since then but not for lack of trying as Alberta has advanced to the Football Canada Cup Gold Medal Game seven times since 2007 but come away with silver each time.

Current players of note who are alumnus of the Football Canada Cup are Mattieu Betts of the B.C. Lions, who is among the league leaders in sacks in the CFL, who played for Team Quebec – and won Gold – in 2012 and offensive linemen Mark Korte of the Edmonton Elks and Justin Lawrence of the Montreal Alouettes – both from Spruce Grove – who played for Team Alberta in 2013.

Many players have advanced to the CFL and NFL but the main focus of the event is on featuring the best high school players in the land. And that's what you'll see in spades this July 7-15 in Edmonton.
