#4 Harry Ainlay Titans at #1 St. Francis Browns Sat. Nov. 23 - 6:00 p.m., Comets Stadium (Raymond)

The rubber match. This will be the third year in a row these traditional powerhouses will meet in the Alberta Bowl. The previous two contests have been tight contests that went right down to the wire with the Titans winning 12-3 in Lacombe in 2017 and the Browns taking the rematch last season with a 3-2 win in Fort McMurray. Defence certainly has been the calling card for these games so it figures that the defending champion Browns might be favoured going into this game. The stingy St. Francis defence, lead by Team Alberta U18 stars Charlie De Land, Adrian Minakata, and Saihaj Virdee, has given up a grand total of 17 points in three games since playoffs began including only a single point to LCI in last weekend's Southern Final. The Titans have Team Alberta U18 stars as well, but curiously they are all on offense with QB Eli Hetlinger, receiver Sony Bermudez-Chavez and massive offensive linemen Evan Beck and Albert Reece. This hasn't hurt them in that category as they have averaged 5 TD's a game ever since their playoffs began and scored 48 points in last weekend's win over Grande Prairie in the Northern Final. Again, it has been said that defence wins championships but on a dry track in good weather in Raymond will the Titans unstoppable force be enough to get past the Browns immovable object. We'll see on Saturday.

#3 Austin O'Brien Crusaders at #1 Holy Trinity Academy Knights Friday, Nov. 22 – 7:00 p.m., Comets Stadium (Raymond)

Green and black are definitely the colours of choice in the Tier II Alberta Bowl Final. Both teams proudly sport these colours and enter the game coming from different perspectives. For the HTA Knights, the path back to the final has been their mission all season after getting to the big game last year only to lose out to the Lloydminster Barons 22-7 in Fort McMurray.

They've been challenged in both of their Provincial games so far but pulled away at the end in each of them to win comfortably by eerily similar scores of 36-22 over Cardston and 35-22 last weekend against Bert Church. On the other side of the ball are the Cardiac Kids from Austin O'Brien. This is the year the field goal counted. Last season they went toe to toe with the eventual Tier II Champions from Lloydminster in the first round only to lose 18-17 on a field goal attempt on the last play that had plenty of leg but hit the upright for no points. This season they found themselves against the Barons again in the Northern Final and staged a comeback for the ages trailing 31-15 deep into the fourth quarter before reeling off 17 unanswered points - including a field goal that counted this time with 33 seconds left – to win 32-31 and advance to their first Alberta Bowl since 2013. These two teams have met before here with the Crusaders winning their first ever Tier II Provincial Championship in 2011 with a 21-3 win over the Knights. Will history repeat itself or will Holy Trinity Academy win their first ever Provincial Title in Raymond in the feature game on Friday night. Should be a classic!

We've been over the record of the Cobras throughout the playoffs as their participation in this game is seemingly inevitable as death and taxes. This indeed will mark Cochrane's 15th appearance in the Tier III Championship game in the last 18 seasons (predating the Alberta Bowl itself by six seasons) and their 11 victories including the last five in a row (a Provincial record for All Tier's) is pretty daunting. To say they know a thing or two about winning this thing would be an understatement and last weekend's 42-0 victory over the Crescent Heights Vikings shows they're poised to make it six in a row. On the other side of the ball are the Holy Rosary Raiders who are on a streak of their own qualifying for their seventh straight Alberta Bowl going back to their days as a Tier IV team in 2013 and 2014. Last weekend they punctuated their run of seven straight Northern Championships with a 56-0 shutout of the Sturgeon Spirits, however where the Northern Final has been heavenly for the Raiders, the Alberta Bowl for the past four seasons has been a Buffalo Bills-esque hell as while they held their own they dropped each and every contest to Cochrane. Will it be business as usual for the Cobras or will the Raiders finally have enough in the tank to take down the perennial favourites? Should be beautiful weather in mid-day conditions for this contest on the turf in Raymond.

Another team looking for redemption from last year are the St. Paul Lions. Always putting out a quality team the Lions finally kicked down the door to the Alberta Bowl last season only to run into the Cinderella Wolverines from Canmore who came from nowhere to win the Alberta Bowl 24-10 over the Lions. This year St. Paul fought their way through the tough Wheatland League to a .500 record during the regular season but have taken off again with a solid 30-12 win over Sexsmith in the first round then a nailbiter 19-14 win over Ardrossan in the Northern Final. Both teams were ranked higher than the Lions going into the contests so St. Paul is definitely on a mission. Facing them are the traditional Tier IV power out of the South, the Willow Creek Cobras from Claresholm who have had no problem getting to the Alberta Bowl in the last five seasons qualifying in 2014, 2015, and 2017 with their only victory coming in 2017 with a 42-0 blanking of Cold Lake. There resume coming into this game is pretty impressive with no one coming within six TD's of them since the playoffs began including a 53-0 shutout of last years Tier IV Champion Canmore Wolverines in the first round and a 48-7 win over the #2 ranked Drumheller Titans in the Southern Final last Saturday.
