UPDATES:

- The 16th Annual **Senior Bowl** High School All-Star Game will be played on **Monday, May 23, 2005**. Game time is **12:00 p.m.** at **McMahon Stadium** in **Calgary**. Both teams have been selected are listed inside this issue.
- New this year is the **1st Annual Bantam Bowl** that will be held on **Monday, May 23, 2005**. Game time is **12:00 p.m.** at **Footie Field** in **Edmonton**. This game is designed to make up for the fact that Alberta Summer Games football competitions for bantam football players are held every second year. The Bantam Bowl is **strictly for graduating Grade 9's** so that they may experience an elite opportunity in their last year of bantam. Both teams have been selected and are listed in this issue.
- Football Alberta is set to once again field a Provincial Team in the **Football Canada Cup**. This years event is scheduled for **Kitchener, Ontario** from **July 2 - 10, 2005** and will field teams from Manitoba, Ontario, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and Saskatchewan. Alberta is coming off a Silver Medal performance from the last two years and hopes to improve on that in 2005.
- Thanksgiving Weekend is set again to host the **10th Annual Football Alberta Thanksgiving Jamboree** that will take place from **Friday, Oct. 7 through Monday, Oct. 10**. This year's event will once again be held at two sites – **Calgary's McMahon Stadium** and the **University of Alberta's Footie Field** - over that weekend. If your team is interested in participating please contact the Football Alberta office. There has already been a mailout sent out for this event and things are filling up fast, however if you are still interested it will be first come first served with no team considered registered until the **\$250 registration fee** is in. As usual, all rental and official fees plus paramedical coverage included.
- Check out the new look **Football Alberta Web Page** which was launched on September 1, 2004. Located at www.footballalberta.ab.ca it will continue the distribution of information about football in our province via the Internet. Special thanks go out to our former webmaster, Mr. Rick Gilson from Grande Prairie for his years of service in creating and maintaining the website as we now turn over the control of the page to Digital Tea.
- **A.S.A.A. High School provincials** are scheduled as follows for all four Tier's in 2005:
Quarterfinals: Saturday, Nov. 12
Semi-Finals: Saturday, Nov. 19
Finals: Saturday, Nov. 26
- The dates for the **Minor Football Provincials** have also been set for 2005. Since the Capital District Minor Association is still the only group offering Atom (age 9-10) football its championship game on Nov. 5 will also be considered the Provincial Title Game. Otherwise the complete schedule for Pee-Wee and Bantam featuring the new Tiers for Provincial competition that were introduced last season are included inside. Each league had a choice as to which levels they will be fielding teams in based on a format developed by Football Alberta. See inside for the schedule.
- Football Alberta would like to welcome to the Alberta football scene one new teams for 2004. The **Prairie Thunder Football League** will add programs in **Lac La Biche** while **Innisfail High School** will be joining the **Central Alberta League** and **J. Percy Page High School** will join the **Edmonton Public League** at the High School level. Welcome aboard!
- **Sport Outreach Scholarships** normally available for the **U of A** and **U of C** Summer Football Camps through the **Alberta Sport Recreation Parks and Wildlife Foundation** are not available this season. Further updates will be included in future editions.
- Thanks go out to the coaching staffs of the five elite programs in Alberta for their support of the Senior Bowl Selection Camps. Due to their efforts we were able to run two complete full weekend Selection Camps in both regions for the first time ever. Special recognition goes to head coaches **Tony Fasano** (U of C), **Jerry Friesen** (U of A), **Gary Durchik** (Wildcats), **Mike McLean** (Huskies), and **Wayne Brown** (Colts).
- The **Alberta Summer Games** have been announced for 2006. They will take place in **Red Deer** from **July 27-30, 2006**. This will mark the sixth time tackle football has been a part of the Alberta Summer Games and with more and more bantam teams joining up each year the competition between the Zones should be greater than ever. Creating the Coaching Staffs for all Zones will be the responsibility of the Football Alberta District Representatives. AWARD WINNERS

2004 FOOTBALL ALBERTA AWARD WINNERS

Here are the Award Winners for the 2004 Season as voted on by the Football Alberta Board of Directors from nominations submitted by the membership at large.

NORM KIMBALL COACH OF THE YEAR

Mike McLean – Head Coach, Edmonton Huskies

The meteoric rise of the Edmonton Huskies into the elite of Canadian Junior Football can be traced to the hiring of Mike McLean as head coach in 2000. Over the past three seasons Mike and his staff have directed the Huskies to the PFC Championship game finally winning it this past season with a 29-10 victory over their nemesis the Saskatoon Hilltops. Two weeks later Mike lead his team to their first National Championship in 40 years with a 24-7 victory over the Okanagan Sun.

A former Golden Bear All-Canadian linebacker and seven year CFL veteran with the Edmonton Eskimos, Mike has brought a passion and dedication to excellence to the Huskies that have truly made them the pride of the CJFL, and as such is a excellent choice as this years Norm Kimball Alberta Coach of the Year!

FRANK MORRIS TIER I H.S. COACH AWARD:

Rick Gilson - Head Coach, Grande Prairie Warriors

2004 was a banner year for the Warriors in more ways than one. Not only did they win their third Peace Bowl in a row, they also ran a 10-0 record all the way to their first Tier I Provincial Championship Game appearance before dropping that game to the defending champion St. Francis Browns. Add to that Rick's coordination of his teams tour of Southern California and his appointment as Principal of his school and you have a very busy yet incredibly successful year.

Always known as one of the most dedicated coaches in Alberta it's a true pleasure to present the Frank Morris Tier I Coach of the Year Award to Rick Gilson.

LAURIE ROBERTSON TIER II H.S. COACH AWARD

Kevin Klotz - Head Coach, Foothills Falcons

Regarded as one of the most successful coaches in the history of Alberta high school football, Kevin Klotz had another banner year in 2004. Winning their fifth straight Rockyview League Tier II Championship the Falcons also advance to their third Provincial Tier II Championship Game in the past five years. To cap off their season they defeated the two-time defending Provincial Champion Archbishop Jordan Scots 34-6 to claim their first title since 2000.

One of the most consistently excellent coaches in the game it is our pleasure to present the Laurie Robertson Tier II Coach of the Year Award to Kevin Klotz.

TIER III H.S. COACH OF THE YEAR AWARD

Olwen Lepps - Head Coach, Beaumont Bandits

What a year for the Bandits as under the direction of second year head coach Olwen Lepps the formerly moribund program streaked all the way to the Provincial Tier III final!

O.J. has been credited with breathing new life into football in the Beaumont area and the on-field performance of his team are a direct result of that. Finishing the season with a 3-3 record in a league that featured many Tier II and I teams the Bandits were defeated by Tier I powerhouse Salisbury 21-6 in the Edmonton Metro semi-finals but earned a berth in Provincials and caught fire. With two thrilling victories, including a 4 overtime marathon vs. Stettler, the Bandits roared through the north only to run into the juggernaut that is Cochrane High School in the final where they lost 47-7. In any event, things are definitely on the rise in Beaumont and mainly due to the hard work and excellence of head coach Olwen Lepps who we are proud to present with the Tier III Coach of the Year Award

TIER IV HIGH SCHOOL COACH AWARD:

Paul Schwartz – Head Coach, Ardrossan Bisons

Seems like old times as it only took Paul Schwarz two years to return the Bisons to exactly the same place he left them in 2001 – as Provincial Tier IV Champions.

Having left the Bisons after their first ever Provincial Title in 2001, Paul returned for the 2003 season and went to work. Last year, in the second season of his second tour as head coach, the Bisons ran the board Provincially and finished the year with a 32-0 shutout over the Willow Creek Cobras in the Tier IV Championship Game. Paul runs a proud, well-coached, classy team that will be a factor for years to come under his tutelage and is a great choice for Tier IV Coach of the Year.

ATOM/PEE-WEE FOOTBALL COACH OF THE YEAR:

Curtis Stappler - Head Coach, Calgary Cowboys

Curtis Stappler successfully coached the Pee-Wee Cowboys to a 7-1 finish in regular season play and then went on to capture the Calgary Pee-Wee Championship and Provincial Tier I Pee-Wee Championship.

Beyond the winning, Curtis is credited with creating a positive environment where sportsmanship and teamwork are valued. His work in teaching his players about life skills as well and X's and O's make him a tremendous example of the kind of coach football needs more of at the minor football level.

For his success on the field, and more importantly for his work off of it, we are pleased to present the Atom/Pee-Wee Coach of the Year to Curtis Stappler.

BANTAM COACH OF THE YEAR

Art Marche – Head Coach, Calgary Bulldogs

One of the most successful coaches in the history of Calgary Bantam football, Art won his 10th league championship in his 29th year of coaching in the CBFA..

Known for his passion for football at the Minor level, Art's team went 8-0 in league play outscoring their opposition by a whopping 42-8 average margin, then defeated the Southern Alberta champion Cardston Cougars 41-2 before dropping the Bantam Tier I Provincial Final game 42-13 to the defending champion Sherwood Park Rams.

For all of that hard work and a successful 2004 it is our pleasure to present the Bantam Coach of the Year Award to Art Marche.

NOVICE COACH OF THE YEAR:

Rob Rawcliffe – St. Albert H.S. Jr. Skyhawks

Nobody came close to the Jr. Skyhawks this season. Running the board undefeated with a 9-0 record which included a flawless regular season and playoff run the 'Hawks finished up winning their schools first ever Edmonton Metro Jr. League Championship.

Upon retiring as a player in 2003, Rob joined the Skyhawks as the head coach of the Jr. team and has lead them to winning seasons in both of his years. He has gone from the field to the sidelines with remarkable ease and had done a terrific job of organization and team management as well. A great future lies ahead for this years Novice Coach of the year, Rob Rawcliffe.

HAROLD FERGUSON OFFICIAL OF THE YEAR:

Jim Schmidt – Calgary Football Officials Association

Jim Schmidt has been an active amateur football referee for over 20 years. He officiates games from Pee-Wee to Junior and has been involved with the Canadian Football Officials Certification Program as a trainer and course conductor for more than 10 years

This past year, Jim revised the curriculum for the CFOCP Level I program and assisted in its implementation. This has proven to be a great boon to the new officials as has been credited with improving retention rates dramatically. A quality man doing a great job for officials across Canada, our Harold Ferguson Official of the Year – Jim Schmidt.

GARY HOBSON AWARD:

Greg Compton – Leduc Minor Football Association

As well as being an accomplished assistant coach Greg Compton has done numerous duties behind the scene to the credit of the sport. In his hometown of Leduc, he was heavily involved in the development of the game at the minor level and has twice been involved with the rejuvenation of the Bantam Ti-Cats program, which included a Provincial Championship in 1995. As well, Greg was involved with the creation of the Beaumont Bandits H.S. team and Tri-County Freeze midget team. It's safe to say that football would be worse off in Alberta and especially Leduc if Greg weren't a part of it. A true volunteer whose efforts have made our province a leader in the development of the game we are proud to congratulate this year's winner of the Gary Hobson Award to Greg Compton.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP AWARD:

Garry Parasynchuk – Strathcona High School

After 20 plus years as a high school football coach, Garry Parasynchuk is stepping down. Thankfully for him he saved the best for last as his Strathcona Lords have won the last five Edmonton Public Championships in a row – a feat unmatched by any Edmonton area team ever.

As well as the league championships, Garry was the defensive coordinator on the Lords team in 2000 and 2001 which won the Provincial Tier I Championship.
