Alberta U19 Team Takes Silver

Team Alberta jumped on the scoreboard first, leading 4-0 at the end of the first quarter but Saskatchewan pulled ahead to win the game 17-4. The Alberta team brought home silver with QB Adam Seniuk throwing an impressive 216 yards for the team in this final game.

Alberta U17 Team South Takes Silver

In mini-game action, U17 Alberta South beat Ontario West (16-14), Quebec (19-1) and lost to Saskatchewan (16-9). In the Gold Medal game, they came home with silver after being defeated by Ontario East 42-7. QB Cody Dickinson put Alberta on the scoreboard with a one yard touchdown plunge.

While U17 Alberta North had several close scoring games they were eliminated from playoff action.

Football Canada Skills Competition

A special twist to Football Canada Cup this year came via the addition of a Skills Competition. Events included a 40-yard sprint, bench press (225 lbs.) and a series of events to highlight different positions. Jeff Sidlowski of the AB South team won the U17 Runningback/Linebacker Challenge, Brad Nehring won the U19 Lineman Challenge, kicker Kevin Hafichuk won the U19 Punting Challenge, Andrew Jevne took the U19 Field Goal Challenge, Brayden Bullen of AB South won the U17 Vertical Jump Challenge and Marcus Goods of U17 North took home the Big Man Sprint title (20 yards for players over 250 lbs.)

U20 IFAF Junior World Championship - a Silver Medal for Canada

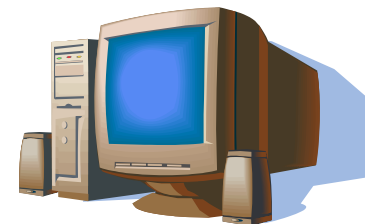
Five Alberta football players, all from the University of Calgary, were on the U20 Team representing Canada at the 2009 IFAF Junior World Championship held in Canton Ohio in July. Congratulations go out to; Kirby Fabian, Linden Gaydosh, Steven Lumbala (St Francis HS in Calgary), Taylor Nill & Carson Rockhill for helping Canada bring home silver. Kirby Fabian (OL) & Steven Lumbala (RB) were named to the All-Tournament First Team. Carson Rockhill was named to the All-Tournament Second Team.

The Canadian team handily beat New Zealand and squeezed out Japan before being defeated by the United States in the gold medal game. The next IFAF World Championship tournament will be held in 2012.

2009 Senior Bowl

Final Score : North 38 South 19

At Calgary's McMahon Stadium on a cold, wet holiday Monday, the "North" streaked to a 23-7 lead on the strength of two Danny Sawchuk touchdowns and two Andrew Jevne field goals.

The Peace River receiver scored on one pass reception from Bev Facey's Adam Seniuk and one fumble recovery in the end zone while the Sylvan Lake receiver/kicker was good from 17, 24, and 32. The "South" countered back right before the half on a one yard plunge by Raymond's Storm Bartsoff (the convert failed).

The "North" opened the second half with a touchdown pass from Garrett Gleisner to St. Albert's Aaron Watkins which was answered later in the quarter by the "South" with Bartsoff's second touchdown of the day (2 point convert attempt ailed).

Jevne added his fourth field goal of the game early in the fourth to push the score to 32-19 and defensive lineman Joel Seutter from Salisbury scored on a short yardage offensive play with less than a minute left (convert failed) to make the final 38-19.

The real story of the game was turnovers as the "South" committed ten to the "North's" none. The series now stands at 10-9-1 in favor of the "South".

Two Alberta officials, Sue Childress and Brian Verlaan worked at the tournament and had the opportunity to attend an official's clinic.

Saturday July 25

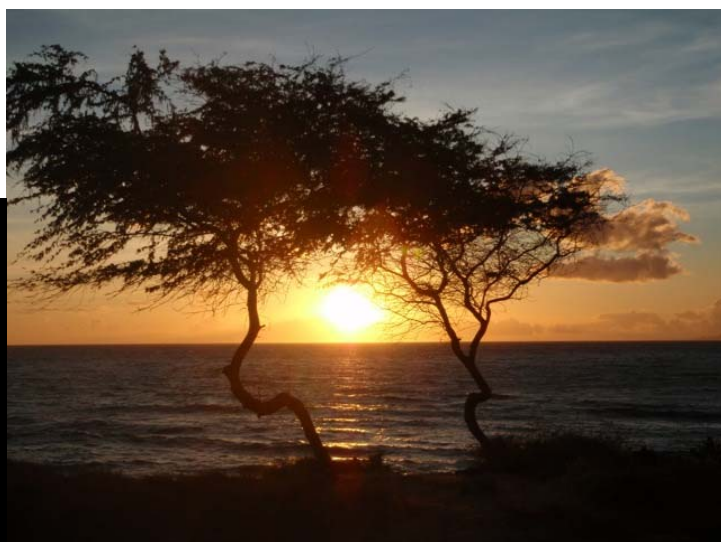
Team Alberta Hawaii

Minor Provincials Update

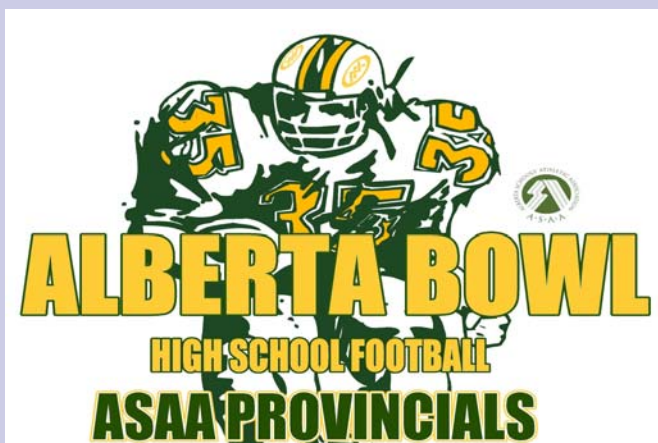

Team Alberta Coaching 2010-2012

The coaching staffs for the Team Alberta programs are on a three year rotation. This past Football Canada Cup marks the end of the current coaching staffs engagement and we will be welcoming applications for the next three years this fall. The Football Canada Cups for that time period are scheduled for Nova Scotia in 2010, Alberta in 2011, and Ontario in 2012. If you are interested in joining the program please be aware of the following:

- Starting in 2010, each province will only be allowed to send one representative team at each level of the Football Canada Cup. For Alberta this means that we will only be fielding one U17 team (rather than the North and South teams in the past three years) and one U19 team (as per usual). Therefore rather than the 18 coaches we accessed for the past three years for the next rotation we will only be needing 12. As per usual the head coaching candidates must be fully certified NCCP Level III while assistant coaches require an old NCCP Level I certification or equivalent under the new NCCP.
- Coaches will have the choice of applying to one or both programs as either a head coach candidate or assistant coach candidate. Only head coach candidates will be short listed and interviewed by the Provincial Team Selection Committee (PTSC) made up of members of the Football Alberta Board and Staff. Assistant coach candidates will simply be putting their name into a pool to be selected from by the head coaches & the PTSC once the head coaches are finalized.
- The preferred guidelines for coaching selection will have 3 of the coaches on each team from Northern Alberta (i.e. Red Deer and north) and 3 from Southern Alberta (i.e. south of Red Deer). No more than 4 of the coaches on each staff can come from either the City of Calgary or Metro Edmonton areas and no more than two coaches from the same current staff can be one of the Team Alberta staffs. However, that is dependent on the strength and number of the applications. If there is not sufficient applications to meet those guidelines then leeway will be allowed as approved by the PTSC.

The timelines for application are as follows:

October 15: All applications must be sent into the Football Alberta Office

November 15: Head Coaching Candidates are short listed and invited for interview.

December 15: Head Coaching Candidates are finalized

January 15: Assistant Coaches are finalized

Still interested? Well you will find the application in this copy of the Wideside and also on-line at www.footballalberta.ab.ca, but BEFORE YOU DO PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING:

The Football Canada Cup and related Selection Camps are a 24/7 football overdose. They are much, much more than simply coaching a team between the lines. The successful candidates for the head coaching position must be big picture thinkers and understand that they are responsible for the off-field department and behaviour of their team as much as they are for their proper development as a team. Both teams will be assigned a General Manager, Athletic Therapist, and Equipment Manager, but that does not absolve the coaching staff of off field duties. Coaches will be active participants in travel assis-

tance, field clean-up, curfew enforcement, and any other duties that present themselves during their tenure on the team. If you are only interested in the on-field coaching and are not interested in anything else beyond that then this program is not for you.

Attention Head Coaching Candidates:

As the head coach you will have total control of the on-field part of the team. You will be totally responsible for the development of the initial selection camps for the Senior Bowl (for U19) or the U17 team as scheduled by the Football Alberta office. You will also be totally in charge of the design of the training camp for your team within the timeframe set by the Football Canada Cup guidelines and as booked by Football Alberta. These positions will involve three weekends in the spring for the U19 coach and one for the U17 coach and 12 days each in July for the Football Canada Cup. For this you will be given an honoraria of \$1500 for the U19 Head Coach and \$1000 for the U17 Head Coach. For your information in advance so there are no misunderstandings, here is a list of things that you will NOT have a say in and must accept as gospel from Football Alberta or the FCC in order to properly function as a team:

- Selection Camp dates
- Training Camp dates and number of practices
- Jersey Design and Color
- Athlete numbering
- Transportation to FCC
- Support staff selection
- Player eligibility
- FCC curfew times and other rules pertaining to behaviour.

Attention Assistant Coaching Candidates:

As an assistant coach you will be responsible for whatever duties you are assigned by the head coach. This could range from coordinating an offense or defense to simply just coaching a position with no input into systems. In any event you should be willing to accept whatever role provided to you no matter how great or small with a positive attitude and a eye on the big picture. The FCC is always more enjoyable when everyone pitches in. This position will involved three weekends in the spring for the U19 coaches and one for the U17 coaches as well as 12 days in July for the Football Canada Cup for which all assistant coaches will receive a \$200 honoraria.

Team AB Coaching Application Form

Following this information page, you will find the application form and supporting document checklist.

The U19 will remain a strictly Provincial Team selected from graduating Grade 12's that will be participating in the Senior Bowl. The U17 program will also only be one Provincial Team starting in 2010 but will be selected via a preliminary North and South Camp followed by a main camp in May (i.e. they will have no provincial all-star game in between selection and participation in the FCC).

The new coaching staffs will be expected to fulfill a three year commitment to their respective team. Please read the following for important information prior to applying for any of the available positions.

Time Commitment:

For the U19 there would be the usual expectation of two weekends in April (for the North and South Selection Camps), the full May long weekend (for the Senior Bowl), plus up to a 12 day commitment in July (for the training camp and Football Canada Cup). For the U17's there would only be the expectation of one weekend in May (for the Provincial Team Selection Camp) and up to a 12 day commitment in July (similar to the U19).

How will the Selections Work:

For those on staff with the U19, in April you will be a part of the player selection process for the Senior Bowl High School All-Star game. In May you will come to the Senior Bowl Main Camp and Game where you will select your team. For the U17's separate North and South Preliminary Selection Camps will be run in either February or March by the University teams, that you do not need to be a part of, then followed up in early May with the Main Selection Camp where you will select your team. Both teams will then not get together until July for the training camp following the selections.

What is the Football Canada Cup like:

The FCC for both U19 and U17 is a National tournament vs. other provincial teams. Alberta usually has a three day training camp prior to going to the FCC. Once there, the event lasts for 8 days in July and normally will feature, at the most, 3 games depending on the tournament structure used which is dependant on the number of teams participating at each level. At the end a National Champion is crowned at each level.

Qualifications:

For all coaching staffs the qualifications are the same:

- **Head Coach** - Fully certified a Level III through the NCCP
- **Assistant Coach** - Fully certified at Level I through the NCCP or its new equivalent.
(Note: this now incorporated Part "A" of the new Theory component).

All applicants must include proof of certification. No "partials" will be accepted.

Who is Making the decisions:

A Provincial Team Selection Committee (PTSC) made up of members of the Board of Directors and staff of Football Alberta has been struck and it will be their goal to finalize the selections for each team.

Coaching Selection Timelines:

All applications are required to be into the Football Alberta office by *Thursday, October 15th*. Over the following month the committee will shortlist head coaching candidates for interview in late November or early December. Once selected the Head Coaches of each team will fill out the other five positions on staff from the pool of applications for assistant coaches with the help of the PTSC.

Note that it is our hope that the staffs will have an equal number of coaches from North and South Alberta as well as no more than four coaches from either Calgary or Metro Edmonton and no more than two coaches from any current staff on each team - *however* that is all dependent on the strength and number of applications. Final coaching rosters should be finalized by January 15, 2010 for presentation to the Football Alberta AGM at the end of the month.
