Football Alberta Coaching Awards for 2016 Season

Football Alberta annually recognizes outstanding coaches who have made a commitment to their team(s) and/or the sport of Football in our Province. Winners of the 2016 Coach of the Year Awards were selected from among many nominees and will be presented with their awards at either the Senior Bowl or Bantam Bowl banquets, whichever location works best for the award winner.

Harold Ferguson Official of the Year Award Dan Aloisio—Edmonton Football Officials

Dan has been a consistently excellent official in the Edmonton area. Handling mainly games from High School on down, Dan has won several awards from both the Capital District Minor Football Association and the Metro Edmonton High School as their Official of the Year including this past years Terry Connolly Award as the top high school referee in Edmonton. Dan stepped into the role of Vice President of the EFOA and worked on developing a culture of cooperation between coach and official in terms of discussion of the rules during the games. His on-field demeanor is very disarming and he is one of the most approachable and consistent referees in the EFOA. IN 2016 he was the head referee for the Pee-Wee Provincial Championships and handled that assignment to perfection. Dan's focus is on the grass roots of the game and does an excellent job anytime he is assigned to a game.

Novice Coach of the Year Bryce Hughes—Paul Kane High School

In his third year of coaching, Bryce continues to grow as a excellent young coach. Starting with the St. Albert Fury Bantam Team two seasons ago, Bryce was a leading force in their Tier 3 Championship. From there he took over coordination of the St. Albert Minor Football Spring Camp for all teams in SAMFA and ran an excellent event. Moving to high School this year, Bryce was the offensive line coach for the Paul Kane H.S. Jr. Team and that unit has never had a better mentor. Taking over a group who were 100% new to the sport he fashioned a line that helped lead the top offense in the league giving up only 2 sacks on the year and being a big part of 17 TD passes. Bryce, has a very bright future in the sport and is the poster boy for what every school should be looking for in a young, enthusiastic, knowledgeable football coach. He has a great mix of passion and positive reinforcement in his coaching style and is a pleasure to work with. Very worthy of the Novice Coach of the Year Award.

Atom / Pee-wee Coach of the Year Ken Coffee—Leduc Wildcats Pee-Wee

2016 was a big year for the Wildcats as they went undefeated in regular season play then cruised through the CDFMA playoffs winning the Tier I Championship. From there they advanced to the Provincial Tier I Championship game where they defeated the Calgary Pee-Wee Stampede 56-14. For their efforts on the year the Wildcats were awarded Top Offensive Team, Top Defensive Team, Most Sportsmanlike Team, and their head coach was named Coach of the Year at the Pee-Wee Level by the CDMFA. For this Ken Coffee is the 2016 Atom/Pee-Wee Coach of the Year.

Bantam Coach of the Year Jim Skitsko—Sherwood Park Rams

Another banner year for the Rams. 2016, Jim Skitko's 21st season as head coach of the Rams, has seen the Sherwood Park powerhouse win their 8th Provincial Tier I Championship. This year the Rams ran the table in the CDMFA and finished off the year with an impressive 56-0 win over of the Stony Plain Blue Bombers in the Tier I Final. Moving on to Provincials they defeated the Raymond Jr. Comets 35-14 in the Semi-Finals and the Calgary Hilltoppers 36-22 in the Provincial Tier I Final. This is the fifth Football Alberta Bantam Coach of the Year Award for Jim Skitko.

High School Tier IV Coach of the Year Darryl Korody and Cam Cote - Bow Valley Bobcats (Cochrane)

Flying under the radar for most of the year the Bobcats took off in Provincials running the board with victories over higher ranked Willow Creek and W.R. Myers to make it to their first Provincial Tier IV Alberta Bowl appearance since 2002. There they left no doubt with a 22-13 win over the tough Stettler Wildcats. For that we recognize the joint team of Darryl Korody and Cam Cote for their stellar leadership in taking the Bobcats to the title and are proud to present them with the Tier IV Coach of the Year Award.

High School Tier III Coach of the Year Jim Forrest - Cochrane Cobras (Cochrane)

An unsung hero of the success at Cochrane High School, Jim Forrest has served as an assistant coach there since 1999 and has been a huge part of the 10 Provincial Tier III Championships the Cobras have won since that time. Jim's specialty is coaching linemen as has developed ten linemen over the years who went on to play University football and two who made it professionally to the CFL. A true behind the scenes master of his craft, Jim Forrest is the 2016 Tier III Coach of the Year.

High School Tier II Coach of the Year
Kyle Sedgwick - Hunting Hills Lightning (Red Deer)

In 2016 the Hunting Hills Lightning qualified for Provincials for the sixth straight season. They also made their eighth straight appearance in the Central Alberta League Championship game having won five times previously. This kind of consistent excellence doesn't just happen. It takes strong leadership and quality coaching both on and off the field. Kyle Sedgwick embodies those traits to a tee. Having coached the Lightning to powerhouse status at the Tier II level as well as having stints on Team Alberta and Team Canada coaching staffs, Kyle Sedgwick is the 2016 Tier II Coach of the Year.

Frank Morris Tier I Coach of the Year
Gino Castellan - Notre Dame Cougars (Red Deer)

For a long time the Central Alberta League struggled to send a team to the Tier I Provincial Playoffs. Well, this year it wasn't a struggle at all as the powerful Cougars closed out a solid Central Alberta League season, where they only lost once, with a League Championship and followed that up with a 27-8 first round upset over the #4 ranked Harry Ainlay Titans as the #8 ranked team. From there they became the only team to take a lead vs. the #1 Bev Facey Falcons in the Northern Final before bowing to the Falcons 32-13. For this, as well as his commitment to the game of football off field as a Football Canada and Football Alberta Board Member and NCCP Facilitator, we are proud to present Gino Castellan with the Frank Morris Tier I Coach of the Year Award.

Norm Kimball Coach of the Year Award
Wayne Harris - University of Calgary

It's not easy being the head coach of a University program. With all the extra duties of recruiting and fundraising it takes a person of great character to lead the way. Wayne Harris has to that and more during a very challenging year for the U of C. As head coach of the Dinos, Wayne them to a surprising Hardy Cup win and followed that up with a 50-24 win in the Mitchell Bowl over St. Francis Xavier to advance to the Vanier Cup in Hamilton. Unfortunately, that was as far as they went losing a tight game to Laval, but the perseverance the Dinos showed through several injuries and setbacks to climb to the level they did is all testament to the man at the helm - Wayne Harris - the 2016 Norm Kimball Coach of the Year.

A true leader and developer of the sport, Len and his wife Peggi have dedicated the past 20 years to the creation of and continued development of the Mavericks Football teams at the Atom, Pee-Wee, Bantam and Midget level. As well as serving as the head coach of the Bantam and Midget teams for years, Len put in countless hours in the off-field operations of the program and served as Club President for many years. After stepping down from coaching in 2015, he continues to oversee the operations of the Mavericks and its over 50 volunteers each fall keeping it at a high standard as one of Alberta's top minor football programs and we are proud to give the Gary Hobson Volunteer Award to Len Guenther.

Gary Hobson Volunteer of the Year Award
Co-winner
Rod Kirby - Lloydminster Minor Football Association
(presented posthumously)

Football in Lloydminster has never been healthier or more productive. Both high school teams are annually participating in Provincials, and minor teams at both Bantam and Pee-Wee have won Provincial Titles in recent years. Many people have played a part in that but none more important than Rod Kirby. Joining the LMFA when it only has one bantam team he expanded it to a second bantam team and four pee-wee teams and served as the Commissioner of the Lloydminster Pee-Wee League for several years. He wasn't too bad as a coach either leading the Lloydminster Red Dogs to the CDMFA Tier I Midget Championship this past spring. Sadly, just after that championship, Rod passed away unexpectedly. He will be greatly missed but his legacy will live on in Lloydminster football forever.

Gary Hobson Volunteer of the Year Award

Jodianne Noel—Mighty Peace Pee-Wee Association

Ten years ago, Jodianne Noel was the driving force behind the creation of the Mighty Peace Pee-Wee Football League. At that time it featured just four teams but with hard work and attraction of a solid Board of Directors, as President she has overseen the development of that league to now boast 10 teams from all over the Peace Region. As well, her and her husband Bryan have brought stability and excellence to the Grande Prairie Bronco bantam team. She has also served as the General Manager for the St. Joseph's Celtics High School team which is no easy trick with their "barnstorming" tour each year that sees them travel to all parts of Alberta. A dream volunteer for all levels of football in Grande Prairie and the Peace Region, Jodianne is a very deserving winner of the Gary Hobson Volunteer Award.

Life Membership / Hall of Fame Award Susan Morgan—Edmonton Chargers (presented posthumously)

In a volunteer role stretching close to 30 years, Susan Morgan's accomplishments are truly too numerous to mention. Started with Edmonton Chargers in 1989 as a General Manager, Susan not only stabilized their program but helped other teams stay afloat in a dark time for minor football. Eventually volunteering with the CDMFA and holding several positions, Susan was the main driving force behind its expansion from 7 bantam teams to over 60 teams and five different levels of play. As a Football Alberta DR, she was instrumental in the start-up of Minor Provincials, Bantam Bowl, Team Alberta U16 and footballs involvement in the Alberta Summer Games. Susan passed away in June of 2016 and will be dearly missed by all involved in the Minor Football world both locally and Provincially and is one of the most deserving additions to the Life Membership/Hall of Fame Award we've ever had.

Life Membership / Hall of Fame Award Larry Olexiuk—St. Albert Minor and High School Football

Larry Olexiuk's involvement in football stretches back to 1967 with his first year of coaching the offense with the Jasper Place Bantam Lions. A year later he became the head coach of the Palmer 49er's Bantam team in St. Albert and began a close to 50 year love affair with football in that city. Over the years, Larry was instrumental in coaching at all levels of the game in St. Albert and also supported the Edmonton District Bantam Football Association as head coach of their all-star team in 1986 and 1987. His most important role in St. Albert was as the main driver for the creation and initial funding of the St. Albert High School Football Association in 1986. Prior to that players had to leave the city to play high school football. Since that time the high school situation has grown from one senior team to football at all three high schools in St. Albert. Thanks to Larry over 200 young men get to play high school football in their hometown each season. Very deserving of the Life Membership/Hall of Fame award.

Football Alberta Scholarship Program—Deadline June 9th

Applications are being accepted from athletes in Alberta Tackle Football High School programs...provided their school Football teams are confirmed paid members of Football Alberta in the year of the application. The applicant must be a graduating Grade 12 player having played tackle high school football within the Alberta Schools Athletic Association (ASAA) system.

The recipient must be registered for full time attendance (as stipulated by the institution) at an accredited Alberta post-secondary institution all year or both semesters. The program of study must be a minimum two (2) years in duration. The Applicant must be participating on a post-secondary Alberta football team of their choice during the year of application.

WHAT IS AVAILABLE? (8 Scholarships are available for the 2017/ 2018 year) x \$2,000.00 each = \$16,000.00

- Six (6) scholarships, including the Brock Jacobs Scholarship in honor of the passing of Football Alberta's Calgary minor board member, plus one (1) additional in Edmonton and one (1) in Calgary are available thanks to Calgary Stampeders and the Edmonton Eskimos 50/50 support program. There are 5 Scholarship/Award regions with each demographically equal region having the capability of receiving one award winner each year (see below). Regions will be Northern Alberta, Edmonton, Central Alberta, Calgary and Southern Alberta based on approximately the same number of teams in each region.
- There must be a minimum of five applicants in a region/zone in order to be awarded a scholarship.
- If a region does not meet the minimum threshold of five applicants, then applicants from that region will be pooled with region that has the next lowest number of applicants.
- If there is a vacant zone, it will be awarded to an applicant from the region with the highest number of applicants.
- If there are two or more regions that have less than the five required applicants, those regions would be combined to create a suitable number of applicants eligible for one scholarship.

League Coordinators and Team Managers

Membership and insurance runs on the calendar year (January 1 to December 31).
