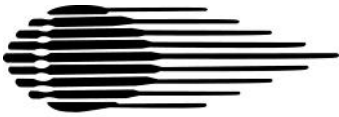

2012 Football Alberta Coaching Awards

Football Alberta annually recognizes outstanding coaches who have made a commitment to their team(s) and/or the sport of Football in our Province. Winners of the 2012 Coach of the Year Awards were selected from among many nominees and presented with their awards at the Senior Bowl and Bantam Bowl Banquets on May 19th, 2013.

Gary Hobson Award (for behind the scenes excellence) Jim Courchesne - Calgary Bantam Football Association

Jim Courchesne's involvement in minor football in Calgary pre-dates the formation of the Calgary Bantam Football Association. Jim started coaching in 1962 and was one of the founding members of the CBFA in 1964. Over the past 50 years, Jim has served as both a coach and administrator in the CBFA and was a driving force behind the development of the outstanding football facility at Shouldice Park. Having served as a director, Vice President, President, and Past President of the CBFA, sometimes on two or more occasions during his tenure, Jim has worked hard to make sure the kids have a level playing field and get an enjoyable season each year. For this we are proud to present Jim Courchesne with the Gary Hobson Award for 2012.

Atom / Pee Wee Coach of the Year Remo Cardone - Calgary Cowboys

Another measure of the success in the Calgary Cowboys organization is the play of their Pee-Wee teams, both of which advanced to Provincial Finals in 2012. The "Grey" team, led by head coach Remo Cardone, finished the regular season with 5 wins, 2 losses, and 1 tie, then got hot rolling all the way to the Provincial Tier II Final where they defeated the Edmonton Mustangs 36-7. Coach Cardone has a long history of success in the coaching ranks having lead teams from Atom to High School but it is for his work with the Cowboys "Grey" team that we are proud to present him with the Atom/Pee-Wee Coach of the Year Award for 2012.

Harold Ferguson Official of the Year Kelly Edgeworth - Edmonton Football Officials

Kelly Edgeworth has been an official in the Edmonton Football Officials Association for 10 years. In that time he has developed into one of the top officials in the Province at the same time giving back to the association serving as Training Chairman for the last 5 years. As Training Chairman he has assisted greatly in the recruitment, training and retention of new officials that have risen to meet the growing demand for officials in Edmonton and Northern Alberta. He is constantly active on field and officiates games from Atom right up to CIS on any given week during the season. On top of that he was named head referee in the Hardy Cup and Mitchell Bowls of the CIS this past season which is quite an accomplishment and makes him a very worthy recipient of the Harold Ferguson Official of the Year Award.

Bantam Coach of the Year Al Cooper - Calgary Cowboys

One of the most successful minor football coaches in the history of Alberta football has risen to the top again. As well as being a prolific builder of the sport, having co-founded the Atom, Pee-Wee and Midget Leagues in the Calgary area, Coach Cooper has also lead his Cowboys to eight City Championships and two Provincial Championships since 1984. This included this year's Provincial Tier I Championship which they won by defeating the Cardston Cougars 28-0. This is made all the more amazing in that the Cowboys organization also fields another bantam team that went on to win the Provincial Tier II Championship. A builder, an innovator, and in 2012 a champion, it is our pleasure to present the Bantam Coach of the Year award to Al Cooper.

Novice Coach of the Year David Holowaychuk -

In 2008 David Holowaychuk was the starting wide receiver for the University of Calgary Dinosaurs. Three seasons later he is the head coach of the Calgary High School Division II Champion Bishop Grandin Ghosts. Quite a rise for a young man whose coaching career is still in its infancy. David is credited with renewing the once proud Bishop Grandin program that had fallen on hard times in the last decade and creating a winning atmosphere where the Ghosts are now hungry to succeed on-field. His institution of an off-field work-out program and a spring camp, which Grandin hadn't seen in years, has pumped new life into the school. A quality young coach who is the perfect example of why this award was created, David Holowaychuk is the 2011 Novice Coach of the Year.

High School Tier IV Coach of the Year Ken Fournier - Drumheller High School

Drumheller is now known for more than fossils and bones and the Valley of the Dinosaur now sports the most successful Tier IV team in the Province. Not once, but twice have they battled the Ardrossan Bisons in hard fought ASAA Provincial

Tier IV finals in the Alberta Bowl and have come away both times with victory, scoring a 41-34 overtime win in 2011 and a 42-21 win in 2012. The architect of this rise to prominence is a local boy returned home, having played for Drumheller as a high school player and now as their head coach leading them to the top of the heap. For this we are proud to award Ken Fournier with the Tier IV Coach of the Year Award.

Rob McNab and Bruce O'Neil - Cochrane High School

The most prolific coaching tandem in Alberta high school history has done it again. Not only did 2012 mark the 22 straight year the Cobras advanced to Provincials but it also marked the ninth time these two have paired up to win an ASAA Provincial Championship. Winning two Tier II Championships in the 1990's has been followed by a remarkable seven Tier III titles in nine attempts in the new Millennium including last season's thrilling 31-20 come from behind victory over St. Albert in the Alberta Bowl. A coaching pair for the ages and they're not done yet. Football Alberta Scholarship Program - June 6th deadline

Applications are being accepted from athletes in Alberta Tackle Football High School programs...provided their school Football teams are confirmed paid members of Football Alberta in the year of the application. The applicant must be a graduating Grade 12 player having played tackle high school football within the Alberta Schools Athletic Association (ASAA) system.

The recipient must be registered for full time attendance (as stipulated by the institution) at an accredited Alberta post-secondary institution all year or both semesters. The program of study must be a minimum two (2) years in duration. The Applicant must be participating on a post-secondary Alberta football team of their choice during the year of application.

WHAT IS AVAILABLE? (7 Scholarships are available for the 2013/ 2014 year) x \$2,000.00 each = \$14,000.00

- Five (5) regional scholarships plus one (1) additional in Edmonton and one in Calgary are available (Thanks to Calgary Stampeders and the Edmonton Eskimos 50/50 support program).
- There are 5 Scholarship/Award regions with each demographically equal region having the capability of receiving one award winner each year (see below).
- Regions will be Northern Alberta, Edmonton, Central Alberta, Calgary and Southern Alberta based on approximately the same number of teams in each region.
- There must be a minimum of five applicants in a region/zone in order to be awarded a scholarship.
- If a region does not meet the minimum threshold of five applicants, then applicants from that region will be pooled with region that has the next lowest number of applicants.
- If there is a vacant zone, it will be awarded to an applicant from the region with the highest number of applicants.
- If there are two or more regions that have less than the five required applicants, those regions would be combined to create a suitable number of applicants eligible for one scholarship.

Football Alberta 2013 Membership & Insurance

Football AB membership and insurance is valid January 1, 2013 to December 31, 2013.

Note: ALL minor teams must take out insurance.

Plan #1 (2013 Team Membership + Player & Team Personnel Accident & Liability Insurance)

Minor / Midget	Team fee of \$157.50 (incl. GST) + \$20.00 per person
High School	Team fee of \$183.75 (incl. GST) + \$20.00 per person
Junior/University	Team fee of \$183.75 (incl. GST) + \$20.00 per person
Senior Men/Female	\$20.00 per person
Flag/Touch	\$7.00 per person

Plan #2 (Team Membership Only, No Insurance)

High School, 6 & 9 Man, Midget, Junior & University teams: \$183.75 (incl. GST). This plan is for teams that have adequate insurance.

Once again, teams and/or leagues should use their username and password to register their team at <https://footballalberta.ab.ca/members/>. Delete players who will not be returning for 2013 and add any new players. Please do not delete players who attend a 2013 practice/gym night or selection camp and then do not play with the team. Insurance payment should be collected from those players and submitted for coverage for the year.

League Coordinators and Team Managers

Membership and insurance runs on the calendar year (January 1 to December 31). It is easiest for league/team administrators to register players at the start of the year for gym nights in January and February and then continue to register players as they join the team. It is extremely important for the welfare of the players and team personnel that insurance is valid (and thus paid for) as soon as you enter your winter/spring roster. Please note that the insurance policy provides both accident and liability coverage. Coverage is required for players playing one day, one week or all season.
