Coaching Philosophy

All players should be given the opportunity to play in all situations. It should be obvious to all coaches that players are not going to develop or get better by sitting on the bench. It is our responsibility to provide all players with a positive sport experience. Players who are given an opportunity and genuine encouragement often surprise their coaches, teammates and selves with their improved play. All players deserve this chance unless their actions clearly demonstrate otherwise.

Bench Coaching Philosophy

The age and ability levels of the players involved dictate to a great degree the bench philosophy of the coach. Factors to be considered when developing a personal bench coaching philosophy may include the seasonal plan and where this particular game fits, timing of the game (only one this week vs. three games in three days), practice evaluation (effort, attendance), recent results (including vs. this particular opponent), travel, discipline (unnecessary penalties, extended shift lengths). Some of these factors are dynamic and may change during the game and require active coaching decisions. As part of their game preparation, the coaching staff will go through all possible scenarios, discuss alternatives and make some preliminary decisions but always considering the effects of our decisions.

- Buy in.... trust in the coaches decisions and demonstrate your commitment to the team

- Maintain your composure always
- Body language never show frustration
- Exude confidence
- Never auit
- Play a team game and in so doing, be a hero
- Recognize the significance of your responsibility it can help us win or help us fail
- Be a good person/player/teammate
- Help the team have fun....in good times and bad.
- Also adhere to our teams core values which is handed out each season
- Go above and beyond our expectations all the time.

Line & Goalie Rotations
