

2023 – 2024 TEAM STAFF REQUIREMENTS FOR GRANDE PRAIRIE MINOR HOCKEY



All must have Team Staff Application forms and Police Information Checks filed with the office, **prior to** being assigned to a team.

For any staff on the bench and the ice, the following is required by application date.

(Respect in Sport Activity Leader will need to be redone every 4 years.)

Head Coach **U18 AAA Male, U16 AAA Male, U15 AAA Male**: High Performance, Respect in Sport Activity Leader, Instructional Stream Checking Skills, Safe Return to Hockey.

Assistant Coaches for same teams: Development 1, Respect in Sport Activity Leader, Instructional Stream Checking Skills

Head Coach and Assistants: **all AA, U13, U15, U16, U18 + Female Elite** need: **Development 1**, Respect in Sport Activity Leader, Instructional Stream Checking Skills.

Development 1 & High Performance require a Coach to be «Certified» in order to meet the requirements. Head Coaches will have to be «Trained» in the course by November 15 of the current season and will have to have completed full »Certification« in the program by November 15 of the following season in order to remain eligible (meaning all post tasks & evaluations done).

Certifications required for coaching GPMHA Minor teams:

All Head and Assistant Coaches must be certified as follows:

All Staff U5, U7 and U9: Coach 1 Intro to Coach online & In person, Respect in Sport Activity Leader.

All Staff U11, U13, U15 U18 (Atom to Midget): Coach 2 Coach Level, Respect in Sport Activity Leader, Instructional Stream Checking Skills **(including female teams)**.

Each team needs:

Trainers need 2: Canadian Hockey Safety Trainers, Respect in Sport Activity Leader

Manager: Respect in Sport Activity Leader

Treasurer: HAS to be experienced in Excel, **must use GPMHA financial package**.

U5 – U18 Recreation teams do not need Treasurers – handled by the office.

Canadian Hockey Safety Trainers & Respect in Sport Activity Leader are fully online.

The first part of Coach 1 Intro to Coach, Coach 2 and Instructional Stream Checking Skills are online.

The last part of Coach Level 1, Coach 2 and Instructional Stream Checking Skills have classroom and ice components.

Development 1 and High Performance Clinics are in person clinics, which are not held in Grande Prairie.

For the Coach Levels and Instructional Stream Checking Skills, you must **complete the online portion BEFORE** you can register for the in-person clinic. Once you attend/do the online clinic, pass and **have all of your paperwork in**, bring in your receipt and you will be reimbursed for the clinic cost. We no longer reimburse for the Respect in Sport Activity Leader online course.
