ANTIDOPING POLICY

POLICY STATEMENT

Halifax Dunbrack Soccer Club (HDSC) has committed to adhere to Canada Soccer's Anti-Doping Policy which has been created in conjunction with Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) and the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP).

HDSC educates coaches, players and parents about this policy through staff/volunteer meetings, player/parent meetings and Club Policies. The Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) is the custodian of the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP); the set of rules that govern anti-doping in Canada. The CADP consists of several components such as in- and out-of-competition testing, education, medical exemptions, and the consequences of doping violations. The CADP is compliant with the World Anti-Doping Code and all international standards. Canada Soccer has adopted the CCES and CADP which means that HDSC is part of a world-class anti-doping program that is designed to protect athletes' rights and ensure a level playing field. Canada Soccer's Anti-Doping Policy reflects and supports the CADP.
