Season Overview

- As everyone is aware, we had a league switch last year. We went from the Northern Alberta Interlock League to the North Eastern Alberta Hockey League.
- One of the biggest issues we faced throughout the season was scheduling. As far as we have heard, scheduling will be done the same way next season, by the managers.

A comment from a member in regards to how they would like to see the way the scheduling is done changed a bit. It seemed that some teams had all their games booked real fast, and other teams were scrambling.

A comment from a member in regards to having U18 games booked in the SHA. For as long as they can remember U18 games have always been booked in the BTA due to the boards being softer. The U18s played a lot of games in the SHA this year. Retiering happened later in the season and then there was no ice available. John mentions how ice was an issue this season. Some teams were split tiers at the beginning of the season, then later on being given an actual tier. Which caused conflict in scheduling games for the rest of the season. A tiering committee is being brought to the table for the Neahl. Hopefully this can alleviate some of the scheduling issues.

- Another issue we faced was complaints about travel. What comes with more travel is more competitive hockey.
- Structure and tiering is yet to be determined, but from the sounds of things it will be the same system as last year.
- The U7 program was very successful this season.
- The U9s were broken into 3 teams. In February, Hockey Alberta introduced changes to the U9 groups with full ice practices and full ice games. As an association, we weren't prepared for that. With this change, the organization for that will be better for next season.
- The U11s had 2 teams. They had the tournament style playoff format. Most members seemed to like it. It helped with the travel.
- The U13s had 2 teams, one which made Provincials and won their league banner.
- The U15s had 2 teams and played in a bracket style for playoffs. U15-1 won their league, as well as went to provincials.
- The U18s had 2 teams both in the contact division.
- For the most part it was a very successful year.

We are working on revamping the tournament policies for next season. These new policies will be a blanketed format.

A member speaks on how it seems that the discipline committee wasn't consistent across the association. The same discipline needs to be enforced to all teams. John says that a new policy is being put in place before next season.

A member speaks on team formation and how the evaluations need to be followed correctly as per our policies and procedures. Question is asked: when evaluations happen, when are the coaches going to get a say in a player's position? Example given of there was at least one kid I went and watched play that definitely shouldn't have been playing on the team they were on. Letting coaches have a little bit of say could help. Some kids during evals could not perform how they do in games. Question is asked: why was there only 1 evaluator for 40 kids? John states we will be working on bettering the evaluation process before next season.
