Season Overview

Another successful season with the NEAHL. Travel has always been a concern and there
may be changes next season. Possibly 12-14 games per season. Hockey Alberta is pushing
the 3hr travel radius. More teams from the east are having issues with travel than west.
 HMHA and members agrees that we would rather have more competitive games than
less travel. Provincials dictate season timeline so the season cannot be stretched out.

Member asks if the amount of games decrease, will the fees? John says not in the short term.

• U7/U9 are developmental years. U9 had 3 teams this year. U11-U18 had 2 teams each division. U11-1 came home with the league banner as well as U13-1 winning the league banner and finishing second in provincials. We have had very successful season and

HMHA teams have been competing in higher tiers than the last few years. Keep up the good work! Thank you to all coaches, managers and parents.

• John asks members if there are any issues specifically with the NEAHL.

Member replies U11 tier 6 deputy/governor lack of communication and no response at times. U11 playoff structure is also an issue. Member suggests the NEAHL should not choose the host team so early in the season.

• Member asks if there will be a checking clinic for U15.

Matt replies yes, checking clinic will be held for second year U13's and U15's.

Member asks if there will be a checking clinic for the U18s before evaluations?

Matt replies that we can look at adding an additional clinic. Not many U18s attend the checking clinics in previous years.

John adds that society is leaning towards non-contact. There is a push from Hockey Canada to have more non-contact teams. A lot of the city teams have moved towards non-contact and have moved ahead. U18 we will likely see more NBC tier 1/2/3 teams.

Matt suggests coaches come out to the checking clinics so they can learn and show their players.

Ice Convener:

Overall, the season went well with no Timberwolves. However, they are back next season. U7/U9 tournament was hosted together. I appreciate the feedback. There were a lot of miscommunications this year and will re-evaluate next year. Will also re-evaluate not having U18 practice times not at 9pm.
