



### Edmonton Federation Hockey League Municipal Facility Guidelines

Municipality	COVID 19 Guidelines
<p><b>City of Edmonton</b></p>	<p><b>Proof of Vaccination</b></p> <p>To enter spaces participating in the Restrictions Exemption Program, people ages 12 and older can provide proof of vaccination.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Valid photo identification that matches the vaccine record (only required for adults 18 and over)</li> <li>• Valid paper or digital vaccine record that shows name, vaccine type and date of administration:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ From September 20 to October 25: proof of partial vaccination (one dose) is considered acceptable as long as the dose was given more than 2 weeks before the time of service.</li> <li>○ After October 25: proof of full vaccination (two doses) is required.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Valid <u>proof of vaccination from other provinces</u></li> </ul> <p><b>Negative Covid-19 Test</b></p> <p>To enter spaces participating in the Restrictions Exemption Program, people aged 12 and older can show proof of a negative test result.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The test result should be a written or printed copy that indicates the individual has tested negative for COVID-19 on a Health Canada</li> </ul>

approved rapid antigen, rapid PCR, or lab based PCR test approved by Health Canada or the lab accreditation body of jurisdiction.

- Valid test results should be a written or printed copy that clearly outlines the type of test, time of sample collection, clear indication of a negative result, and laboratory that completed the test, if applicable.
- Photos of a rapid test or result taken offsite is not sufficient.
- A self-test completed offsite or self-produced documentation of a negative test result is not valid.
- Do not bring completed self-tests or rapid tests to businesses due to communicable disease risk.
- Tests must not be from the Alberta Health Services public COVID-19 testing system.

#### **Medical Exemption**

To enter spaces participating in the Restrictions Exemption Program, people 12 and older can provide documentation of a medical exemption.

- A valid medical exemption is the original signed letter from a physician or nurse practitioner that includes:
  - Person's name that matches their identification.
  - Physician's or nurse practitioner's complete information, including:
    - name, phone number, contact information, professional registration number and signature
    - statement that there is a medical reason for not being fully vaccinated against COVID-19

This will enable the municipalities to maximize resident services and supports, while prioritizing public health and safety.</p> <p>Proof of vaccination will be required to enter all recreation facilities, for guests 12 years of age and older. <b>Please be aware that you will need to show individual proof of vaccination upon entry to facilities. Also note that all guests 18 years and older will also be required to provide valid photo identification that matches the vaccine record.</b></p> <p>The following forms of proof of vaccination:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• proof of single COVID-19 vaccination (one dose) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ accepted until October 25</li> <li>○ dose must be given more than two weeks before date of service</li> </ul> </li> <li>• proof of full COVID-19 vaccination (two doses)</li> </ul> <p>○ required after October 25</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• a privately-paid negative COVID-19 test result <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ within 72 hours prior to service</li> <li>○ rapid or PCR test only</li> <li>○ AHS and Alberta Precision Laboratories results not permitted</li> </ul> </li> <li>• medical exemption documentation</li> </ul> <p><b>**Note: Youth (12-17) PARTICIPATING</b> in sport, fitness, recreation and performance activities are only required to screen for symptoms; maintain 2-metres distancing and wear a mask (except while engaged in physical activity). If youth are SPECTATING, proof of vaccination, medical exemption or paid negative COVID-19 test is required. Note that as of this writing, the City of Edmonton recreation facilities will be requiring proof of vaccination for participating youth.</p> <p>Please note, masking is required in all indoor settings for guests over the age of two years old, except when participating in physical activity. If you have any questions, please contact the facility directly for details.</p>
