GIRLS HOCKEY IN EDMONTON















Mission is to develop and enhance the experience and opportunities for all female players in Edmonton.

Reorganization of female players into a single, large, and prominent association will:

- Enhance connection and communication among age divisions and levels of play
- Create a critical mass to reduce skill disparity on team rosters and place teams into appropriately competitive tiers
- Provide a consistent development for all female players

2023-24 SEASON

- U13 Female teams, Elite & Community, operate out of new Alliance (under FHC for now)
 - Two new U13 AA elite female teams
 - Female teams playing into coed tiers
 - Female teams playing in all-female B or C league in EFHL
 - PLUS one city-wide U11Tier 1 and one U9 Tier 1 all female team
- Create new organization with bylaws and board and staff plans, similar to GHC

- All Elite & Community all-female teams from U7 to U18 move into new organization
- Transition might be U7-U11 in and U15-U18 in two waves over two years depending on capacity of new organization

2024-25 SEASON

WHYSTART AT U13?

- New U13AA program provides a novel opportunity to signal change and the way forward (unite female players, connect community and elite)
- U13 division has the most players in it
- A manageable start toward meeting Hockey Alberta's goals
- Some known support at this specific division for uniting female players
- HSL is looking to roll out this year with U13 female league as well so it addresses competition

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

U13 AA programming:

- Tryout registration opens: June 1, 2023.
- Season registration fees*: \$3,500 (subject to changes based upon playoffs and tournaments).
- Roster size: 17 players (9 forwards, 6 defence, 2 goaltenders).

U13 Community, U11 Tier 1, U9 Tier 1:

- Registration opens: June 1, 2023.
- Season registration fees*:
 - U9 Tier 1: \$750 registration + \$200 development (\$950)
 - U11 Tier 1: \$850 registration + \$200 development (\$1,050)
 - U13 Community: \$900 registration + \$200 development (\$1,100)
- 'Play together' requests can also be made once registration opens.

WHAT TO EXPECT

U13 AA programming:

- 3:1 practice to game ratio
- 30 games minimum, restricted to northern half of the league
- 2-4 tournaments
- Provincial playoff series

U11 Tier 1 programming:

- 18 practices
- 24 games

U9 Tier 1 programming:

- 18 practices
- 18 games

U13 Community programming:

- 20 provided games and 18 practices
- Plus, opportunities to purchase more, and no restrictions on number of tournaments.
- Team roster targets: 15 to 17
- Note: the more competitive teams will play fully into appropriately fitting Co-ed Tiers 1-6.
 Some parity teams will be created and play in the Female B league in EFHL.

- June 5 through Aug 17 (12 weeks), on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday evenings.
 - o On-ice component is Tuesday 7:30 at Callingwood or Kinsmen.
 - Off-ice sessions are on Monday and Thursday (time to be confirmed, but one hour duration, no earlier than 5pm and no later than 8pm).
 - Please note: the off ice schedule being confirmed and will be available at the time of registration.
 - Cost is \$795.00
 - Limited to 30 spaces

PATHWAY

- June 2023 Register in FHA or Coed Home Association*
- August/September 2023 Tryout for U13 AA if applicable
- September 2023 Remain in FHA U13 Community OR withdraw registration and register for Coed Home Association
- September 2023 Try out for U9/U11 Tier 1*

*Awaiting guidance on ideal registration pathway for U9/U11 T1 teams. Website will be updated with all registration information by June 1.

PLAYER EVALUATION PROCESS


U13 AA programming:

- Dates: August 24 to September 4.
- Player Evaluation
 Process: Coach
 evaluations, Elite
 Director oversight.
- Three skates guaranteed at U13 AA (one skill evaluation, two games).

U13 Community, U11 Tier 1, U9 Tier 1:

- Dates: September 5 onward.
- Player Evaluation Process: non-biased third-party evaluators, Community Director and Evaluations Committee oversight.
- Three skates guaranteed at EFHA U13 Community (one skill evaluation, two games).
 - If a player chooses to play co-ed after the EFHA U13 Community session, three skates are not guaranteed with your "home zoned" association. One skate will be ensured for the U9 and U11 teams in the first week of September so that players who are cut can go back to home associations and not miss those evaluations.

COACHING REQUIREMENTS



U13 AA programming:

- Head Coach Credentials: Development 1,
 Checking Skills, Respect in Sport (Activity Leader), Keeping Girls in Sport course
- Assistant Coach Credentials: Coach 2,
 Checking Skills, Respect in Sport (Activity Leader)

Did you know?: Elite Stream (AA and AAA) Coaches (Head and Assistant) are held to a higher standard of credentials by Hockey Edmonton than any other association in Hockey Alberta.



COACHING REQUIREMENTS

U13 Community, U11 Tier 1, U9 Tier 1:

- U9 Head Coach Credentials: Coach 1, Respect in Sport (Activity Leader), Keeping Girls in Sport course.
- U11 Head Coach Credentials: Coach 2, Checking Skills, Respect in Sport (Activity Leader), Keeping Girls in Sport course.
