



"CLASH with CHAOS" Tournament Rules

Sanction # HA-23367497

1. First and foremost, it is all about the kids, so let's make sure they have as much fun as possible!
2. This tournament will follow Hockey Canada and Hockey Alberta rules.
3. This tournament is a U13B female hockey tournament and is non-checking.
4. Each team shall be permitted to take one time-out of 30 seconds during the course of regular playing time or overtime. This time-out must be taken during a normal stoppage of play.
5. Round Robin game times are 90 minutes – 5 minutes for warm-up, three 20-minute stop time periods. Should time be running tight in the 3rd period, with 5 minutes left, the clock will be dropped to 2 minutes. This will allow time for handshakes and awards. Round robin games can end in a tie.
6. Game points in the round robin games:
 - Win = 2 points
 - Tie = 1 point
 - Loss = 0 points
7. If team points are tied after round robin play, the following tie breaker will be used to determine placement for the final games:
 - 1) Head-to-Head Game Results (Tied teams only)
 - 2) Goals For Average (GFA) = GF/(GF+GA). The team with the highest GFA is the winner. (Tied teams only)
 - 3) Lowest Penalty Minutes. (Tied teams only)
 - 4) Coin Toss. (Tied teams only)
8. Finals game times are 105 minutes – 5 minutes for warm-up, three 20-minute stop time periods. If any of the final games are tied at the end of regulation time, there will be an NHL style sudden victory over-time three on three for 3 minutes. If there is no goal within that 3 minutes, the game will be decided in a shootout. Home team will decide who shoots first. The shootout will involve 3 skaters from each team. If still tied, then it will continue with 1 player from each team – sudden victory style – until a winner is declared. No player can go a second time in the shootout until all players have had a turn.
9. Tournament Committee reserves the right to adjust the format of tournament and games.
10. For each game, including finals, each team will pick their own 'Heart & Hustle' and 'MVP' winners. Teams will line up on the blue line after handshakes and coaches will present awards to their own team.
11. Only players listed on the submitted team rosters will be allowed to participate. No substitutions or additions are allowed without prior approval from the tournament committee. All players must be currently registered in their respective league within Hockey Alberta and only registered and approved affiliates for your team may be added.
12. The referees' decisions are final in all matters pertaining to the rule interpretations, assessments of penalties and awarding of goals and assists.
13. Any players and/or coaches that receive a referee write up will not be allowed to participate in any further games until a ruling is received from Hockey Alberta.
14. Any fighting penalty or gross misconducts will result in player(s) and/or coach(es) being immediately suspended from the tournament.
15. Team officials are responsible for their teams conduct on and off the ice and must ensure their players always conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike manner.
16. Parents, players, and coaches all need to behave according to the Hockey Canada Code of Conduct. No verbal, mental or physical abuse will be tolerated.
17. Dressing rooms must be left clean at the end of each game.
18. Each team is responsible for bringing two sets of team jerseys. **HOME TEAM = DARK & AWAY TEAM = WHITE**
