Hockey in the Rockies Tournament Rules

1. Fun First

 This tournament is all about the kids—let's ensure they have as much fun as possible!

2. Rules of Play

- Canadian Hockey and Alberta Hockey rules will apply.
- This tournament is non-checking.

3. Game Time Rules

- No timeouts are allowed.
- Round Robin Games:
 - Duration: 90 minutes (3 minutes for warm-up, three 20-minute stop-time periods).
 - If the 3rd period runs long, the clock will be reduced to 2 minutes with 5 minutes remaining to allow for handshakes and awards.
 - The tournament committee reserves the right to adjust game formats.

4. Mercy Rule

 If a team leads by 5 or more goals, the goals will stop being put up on the scoreboard

5. Points System (Round Robin Games)

Win: 2 pointsTie: 1 pointLoss: 0 points

6. Tie-Breaking Criteria (Round Robin)

- Head-to-head game results
- Point differential (maximum of +5 or -5 per game)
- Lowest penalty minutes
- Coin toss

7. Finals Games

 Duration: 105 minutes (3 minutes for warm-up, three 20-minute stop-time periods).

Tiebreaker:

- A shootout will determine the winner if the game is tied after 3 periods.
- The home team will choose which team shoots first.
- Shootout format: 3 skaters per team. If still tied, sudden death shootout will follow.
- No skater may shoot a second time until all players have had a turn.

8. Tournament Adjustments

 The tournament committee reserves the right to modify the tournament and game formats as needed.

9. MVP/Heart and Hustle Selection

- Each team will select their own MVP and H&H for every game, including finals.
- Teams will line up on the blue line after handshakes, and coaches will present the MVP and H&H awards to their players.

10. **Team Rosters**

- Only players listed on the submitted team rosters are eligible to participate.
- Substitutions or additions require prior approval from the tournament committee.

11. Referee Decisions

 Referee decisions regarding rule interpretations, penalties, goals, and assists are final.

12. Disciplinary Actions

- Players or coaches receiving a referee write-up cannot participate in further games until a ruling is received from Hockey Alberta.
- Any fighting or gross misconduct penalties will result in immediate suspension from the tournament.

13. **Team Conduct**

 Team officials are responsible for ensuring their players behave in a sportsmanlike manner both on and off the ice.

14. Code of Conduct

- All parents, players, and coaches must adhere to the Hockey Canada Code of Conduct.
- Verbal, mental, or physical abuse will not be tolerated.

15. **Dressing Rooms**

Dressing rooms must be left clean after each game.
