3. D3H Partnership

- D3H sponsorship presentation
- HRI receive 2.5% of rooms booked from HRI teams that travel to tournaments
- Teams receive a \$\$ gift card depending on the rooms booked
- D3H sponsorship for tournaments. Novice, Atom usually cover player packages. Older age groups get \$\$.

Hockey Regina Initiation Program Refresh

Background:

For the past few years HRI presidents have been discussing the importance of following Hockey Canada's Long Term Player Development model, however there has been no attempt to actually implement this within HRI. I propose as a board we encourage the structure of the Initiation program to change to better reflect this model.

Current Structure:

The Current Initiation structure is designed to provide set blocks of 5 ice times at which skill development is a secondary focus to playing structured games. All ice times are shared with 1 other team. The current model is as follows:

- 1. 5 Ice Times shared ice practice
- 2. 5 Ice Times 30 Minutes practice and 30 minutes 1/3 ice games
- 3. 5 Ice times 30 minutes practice and 30 minutes ½ ice games
- 4. 5 ice times 60 minutes ½ ice games
- 5. 5 ice times 30 minutes practice 30 minutes full ice games
- 6. 5 ice times 60 minutes full ice games

Under this structure teams are given a maximum budget which they can use for playing in a limited number of 1 day tournaments as well as booking additional practice ice. We currently have players of all skill levels on ice together. As a result Initiation coaches are often only able to work through the 1st half of the Hockey Canada Skills of Gold Program and stronger players don't get the attention they deserve. A majority of teams do not have the support from parents to look for ice mid-week out of town to provide additional practice times.

Other Models:

Saskatoon:

Saskatoon Minor hockey sets up their initiation program with a focus on skill development and a secondary focus on structured games. Each ice time will actually have 3 or 4 teams involved depending on the age group and purpose of the ice time. Ice times allocated until early December are dedicated to practices only. After this it is a 2-1 Practice to Game Ratio. Teams will have approximately 35 ice times allocated over the year. I have attached a copy Saskatoon's Model.

Other Centres:

I looked for detailed information amongst centres such as St. Albert & Sherwood Park. Although I could not find any specific policy on Initiation on their websites one thing I did notice was both centres offered "tiered" programing at the initiation level.

Proposal:

As a board we need to support the initiation level to a greater extent. This is where Player Development begins. It is great that our Coach Mentorship program is focused on providing assistance to coaches at this level and my experience has been positive from this aspect. We now need to give coaches the resources they require to promote skill development and build towards the next level. I propose the following changes be made for the 2015/16 year.

- 1. Ice time allotment adjusted to focus on a 2-1 practice to game ratio. With the current 30 minutes practice/game structure we are currently receiving a total of 12.5 hours of ice time dedicated to skill development which is 1.4 Games to 1 Practice. If we are going to continue to offer 30 ice times this needs to move to 20 hours.
- 2. Remove the current structure of 5 ice times split between practice and games to accommodate the 2-1 ratio. Structure the ice times as dedicated practice and dedicated game days. The hockey Canada Skills of gold manual actually uses about 10 minutes of some of the ice times for 1/3 or ½ ice games. We do not need to schedule this for teams.
- 3. Coach Mentors, HRI President, HRI Initiation Director, & HRI Executive Director will ensure ice time usage is appropriate.
- 4. Recommend that the games scheduled be done so keeping in mind an altered ice surface appropriate for the age group. ½ or 2/3 ice surface based on level.
- 5. Explore the idea of 3 teams as compared to 2 teams per ice time. This would actually allow for in increased number of ice times throughout the season. This can easily be done on any ice time scheduled at Co-operators Centre.
- 6. Split Initiation into 2 programs. I1 & I2 or Junior & Senior. This will allow for a smoother transition to the next level. A lot of players moving up into Novice are not prepared for the changes that come with it. For example, greater emphasis on practice, introduction of rules, and introduction of goal equipment.
- 7. At the senior level encourage the use of goal equipment. This will give every child an opportunity to play goal. At this time with dedicated goalies in Novice there are kids that will never get a chance to truly try the position. This limits our opportunity to discover goalies.

I know that there will be a number of questions on the changes especially from returning parents. In order to implement such a significant change we need to have the strong support from the Board, Coaches and Coach Mentors.

Shooting Stars along with its Founding members, Jamie Heward, Mike Sillinger and Jordan Eberle, as well as a volunteer committee would like to respectfully submit this is a request to be added on to the agenda for the Hockey Regina Board Meeting on September 1st.

We would like to share a SMART HOCKEY presentation with the Board of Directors that would take approximately 10-15 minutes on the agenda. We would like to discuss some injury prevention programming that is on-going with Parachute Canada, specific to traumatic brain injuries. Concussion prevention initiatives are a vital part of programming that the Foundation is working on with one of our funding partner, WorkSafe Saskatchewan. In April of 2015, Shooting Stars hosted an Concussion Awareness event featuring a video on SMART HOCKEY. for players during Brain Awareness Week. Feedback from coaches, parents, and players was very positive. Shooting Stars would like to implement a similar event this fall for athletes as an education on head injuries in sport, mainly concussions.

Objective

Shooting Stars goal is to create a partnership with Hockey Regina, Regina Pats, Saskatchewan Brain Injury Association and PARACHUTE Canada

With this partnership, an event would be held at the Brandt Centre in the fall.

he event would include:

- Players, Coaches and Parents from Hockey Regina within the Novice through Pee Wee Divisions
- The event would include SMART HOCKEY presentations endorsed by Hockey Canada and NHLPA, as well as fun activities that include members of the Regina Pats
- A date and times would be determined for the event to held. (Target: October 2015)

Why this is an Important event...

- Brain Injury Awareness continues to be an important topic in the media, life and sports, including Hockey. Focus on return to play guidelines for coaches and parents as well as treatment programs available
- This event would allow Hockey Regina to be involved in an important event that demonstrates their commitment to injury prevention within its membership

Next Steps

After the September 1st board meeting, a timeline and communication plan will be determined and shared with the Novice and PeeWee Directors for support and communication with coaches and parents.
