Mandate for 2016/17

"All Games and Practices at the Initiation Level shall use modified Ice Surfaces consisting of Cross Ice Sections"

All Tournament Games will be played either using Cross Ice or Half Ice formats.





- Initiation Program Goals
  - To have fun while playing hockey and engaging in physical activity
  - To learn the fundamental skills required to play the game of hockey
  - To create and refine basic motor skills
  - To be introduced to the concepts of cooperation and fair play





- Benefits of Cross Ice Hockey
  - First thing to remember the Kids are 4 6 years old!
  - Parents need to think long term about their kids development, be realistic about what children should be able to do at all age levels
  - Putting players in a competitive environment to early will compromise their development

#### **Benefits**

- Increases the emphasis on skating skills including elements like agility, balance, coordination and quickness
- Number of puck battles increases significantly
- Puck control and puck protection skills are enhanced which help players succeed at higher levels
- All the fundamental skills of skating, puck control, passing and shooting are reinforced at a greater rate through game play

#### Benefits (Continued)

- The increase in incidental body contact requires players to play with their heads up, better preparing players for proper use of body contact and checking skills in the future
- Less time and space increases the frequency of making hockey decisions. Better environment for teaching ice awareness and boosts hockey sense
- Over time, the intensity level of competition increases with the progressive skill improvement of players





#### Cross Ice Jamborees

- The SHA offers Cross Ice Jamborees. To date over thirty (30) have been scheduled. There is no cost to host one as the host community provides the ice and the SHA provides the instructors, all on-ice material including bumpers (if the community doesn't have any).
- The Jamborees are approximately 4 hours in length depending upon the number of kids involved.
- If at all possible we like to include IP coaches on ice to assist

- IP Coach Mentorship Program
  - Mentor Expectations
- 1 mentor supervises 6 9 IP MHA's
- Mentor trains coaches thru: supervision, training and certification, one on one mentoring, COACH 1 clinic, in-person practice supervisions, how to use the coach manual, set up stations, to test after each phase
- 1 to 2 visits pre Christmas
- 1 visit post Christmas
- Mentor promotes cross ice hockey
- Mentor attends training session and season review the first weekend of Feb





#### SHA Season Plans for Age Groups

The SHA has developed **recommended** seasonal plans for age groups that are based upon recommendations from Hockey Canada and within the HC Long Term Player Development plan.

The SHA has taken into account the traditional season in our Province and attempted to break down what would be the ideal length of season at specific age groups and categories of hockey related to areas such as season start date; number of practices; start date for games; what a regular season and playoff for games should be; number of tournaments; total number of games; etc.
