Hughenden Arena Booth Schedule and Expectations 2024-2025

Firstly – We Appreciate your Volunteer Hours! Without you, we could not maintain the function of this facility that brings so much enjoyment to our kids and community!

There are to be 3 ADULTS (age 18+) minimum per game and 1 ADULT (age 18+) per practice. The minimum age of booth helpers is 12. An adult must always be present.

Three caution cheques per family for \$200 each will be required at the start of this season. One \$200 cheque will be cashed for each game or practice the family does NOT work or provide a SUITABLE replacement. The Ag Society can help with finding your replacement if needed.

The FIRST name listed on each week is the LEAD FAMILY. It is their responsibility to contact the arena for their week's scheduled events, and be in touch with the other families to arrange shifts at least 1 week prior. SHIFTS SHOULD BE EQUALLY DISTRIBUTED. There is a list of "Hired" help people posted in the booth if you would rather pay someone to work your week. If, once the arena booth schedule is posted, you find your scheduled week does not work for you, it is YOUR responsibility to switch with another family, and let the LEAD family know who the replacement is. The lead family will then contact a LCSG member to advise of the change, and the LCSG will then approve the chosen replacement.

The booth MUST be open 1 HOUR BEFORE start of game, and 1/2 HOUR BEFORE practices. IF THERE ARE ANY QUESTIONS, PLEASE CONTACT DONNA LEFEBVRE AT 780-806-1304.

The booth week begins on THURSDAYS and ends on WEDNESDAYS.

(With a lot of new Parents/Players we have made a decision that working the game's FIRST will give them a feel for how to run the booth during the week when they work alone.)

Thursday: No booth required.

Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday: Open 4:45. Close when LAST practice team gets on ice and/or orders from previous practice are completed.

Friday, Saturday & Sunday: As required by games that are scheduled.

Teams must work their own practices and games on the following dates:

November 10 (U11 will provide own staffing)

November 21-November 27 (Due to Minor Hockey Day)

December 1 (U7 Tournament will provide their own staffing)

During these time periods, practices must be run by a volunteer from that age group during the week. For games during these periods, there must be at least 3 volunteers for each age group during their own games.

If additional tournaments are booked, the host team provide staffing for ALL of the games during that tournament.
