COVID-19 Facility Guidelines for Players, Parents, Coaches, Referees, Volunteers and Arena Spectators

RDPH will adhere to all public health guidelines that have been implemented by each municipality or facility, and we ask for the full cooperation of RDPH players, parents and spectators in abiding by the guidelines.

We recommend that families allow extra time to enter facilities and be prepared to show the required information to facility staff, as there may be lineups to enter facilities. Entrance to facilities are through the main doors, unless otherwise noted.

If you are feeling unwell or ill, please stay home. If you suspect your illness may be related to COVID-19, visit the Alberta Health COVID-19 website for more information and guidance.

Please continue to treat facility staff and each other with kindness, patience and respect.

Note: Information outlined below is subject to changes made to public heath restrictions or facility guidelines. Updates, clarification and additional guidance will be provided as information is available.

Masking requirements:

	On the ice surface during sport/physical activity.		
Referees	 Mask required: From facility entrance to dressing room, in the dressing room, while in transition to/from the ice surface immediately before/after a game. Mask not required: On the ice surface during sport/physical activity. 		
Time/scorekeeping volunteers	Mask required at all times in the facility.

Red Deer College/Polytechnic – Restrictions Exemption Program (REP) in effect (Gary W. Harris Canada Games Centre)

In addition to proof of vaccination requirements, anyone accessing the RDC campus (including the Gary W. Harris Centre) must sign in <u>each time you attend the site</u>, <u>before you arrive</u>, using the RDC SAFE App – Visitor Button (found under the COVID-19-AB Health daily & vaccination verification).

For those without access to a smartphone, a console/device will be available at the main entrance to complete the online sign in through the RDC SAFE App.

*Note:

As of October 25, 2021, individuals that are required to show proof of vaccination must be fully vaccinated (at least 14 days have passed since the second dose of a 2-dose vaccine, or single dose of a one-dose vaccine [Janssen]).

Paper records from your vaccination appointment or previous Alberta vaccine records without QR codes that show name, birthdate, and vaccination type and date will be accepted until November 14.

Alberta vaccine record with QR Code will be the only valid Alberta proof of vaccination accepted by operators participating in REP as of November 15.
