

BC vaccination Card Verification Approach

G.R. Pearkes Recreation Centre

The updated PHO Gatherings and Events Order is expected to be updated Friday, September 10, taking effect on Monday, September 13.

Given the limited time we have to implement, the following outlines GR Pearkes Recreation Centre's approach. This will be in effect until full implementation can take place, after the detailed order is released.

Effective September 13, 2021

- Proof of **one dose** is required for entry to **all adult sport and fitness programs/services**, including, skating, weight rooms, and all other indoor fitness classes. Proof is provided via smart phone or paper copy.
- Youth 18 years and under will **not** have to present proof of vaccination at this time
- Patrons must present proof of vaccination plus government-issued photo ID
- Government issued photo ID means a driver's licence, passport, BC Services Card or BCID
- Visual verification only is acceptable (ie no QR code scan)
- Stanchions in the lobby will be used to funnel applicable patrons to the Reception area for vaccination checks.
- **Rental User-groups will be responsible to conduct Vaccination Checks of their participants, and spectators.**

Exempt from Vaccination Checks:

- Guardians/Parents dropping their child off
- Pedestrians using the facility to access the Park, or SNP Daycare behind the facility
- Community members using the public washroom facilities
- Participants and Coaching staff of Child & Youth Sport Rental User-groups
- User-groups and facility partners offering essential services, such as Childcare (ie licensed preschool, before/after school programs etc).

Acceptable Vaccination Proof

A partially vaccinated (one dose) BC Vaccine Card looks like this:



A fully vaccinated (two doses) BC Vaccine Card looks like this:



No record found looks like this:



From **September 13, 2021 to September 26, 2021**, people will also be able to use the vaccination records they got at B.C. vaccine clinics or pharmacies as valid proof of vaccination, accompanied by government-issued ID.
