- Old Business
 - A. Zone Program Dean Pickup, manager of the Bantam Zone team delivers an update on the team. It has not been a good season, great losses but not much we can do. BC Hockey may announce a major bantam team. Realigning the zones may be an option.
- Financial Report Treasurer Terry Phelps

Everything is pretty straight forward in a predictable pattern. We need some help from Divisional Managers getting budgets, 75% are not in yet. Why do we need them?

- 1. We keep stats we want to have a reasonable explanation for costs for teams.
- 2. We have some historical budgets that are out of wack with what was needed.
- 3. We also want to make it reasonable for all families to be able to participate.

Everything is fine, teams seem to be doing well. Ref side is not great, but we have a solution for now. We have three teams not using RAMP at this time, we should find out why. It would be easier administratively if everyone was on RAMP.

• President's report

-I have some feedback regarding the board. The feedback is all good. Thank you for carrying ourselves in the community and the jobs are being handled professionally. I appreciate all that you do. Please be mindful that when we go to tournaments, act appropriately. We have had issues with parents charging scorekeeper booth, accosting refs, and picking fights in hallways. If there are any concerns, please email the appropriate people and give us a chance to resolve it.

I attended the President's meeting last Tuesday. We are improving as a group. Half of the president's are in their first year, working on communication and better rapport between associations. We want to standardize the Novice rosters, as there isn't any yet. We are the model, others will follow.

Lateral affiliates – goaltenders, if you only have one, find another and put ALP beside their name. You cannot use affiliates until below 14 skaters. If you need a goalie lateral affiliate, you need three things: 1. A reason why you need them, 2. Have tried an AP goalie but they are not available 3. Get approval from Jim.

In regards to PCHA, we have not heard anything back from them. We have advised BC Hockey that we will not be supporting them next year.

- **Registrar** AP movements being made, but everything seems to be ok.
- **Asst Registrar** no report

Head Referee/Ref Allocator - Galen gave an update regarding season. We have a team of 7 senior officials and 16 in their first year. We have had 13 mentorships happen. Hockey Canada evaluations looking at penalty standard, skating and locker room attitude. We have discussed ways to improve, good points; all of this is being received very well. We have worked on puck drops etc. We have held monthly development sessions, about 2 hours per month. We have identified kids who can progress through to higher levers.

There have been three incidents of verbal abuse from our own coaches this past weekend. This can't be happening. If there are coaches abusive towards refs, there will be a bench minor, if it happens again it will be a game misconduct. There is a group of four or five refs who are verbally abusive towards other refs on the ice. We are dealing with this.

Ice Coordinator/Ice Committee

The schedule is out to Dec 7th, the following week everyone only gets one practice due to the World Junior events.

League schedules are not out for house league yet, this is causing some issues. Harold will follow up with this.

Gaming – Lots of bottle drives so far. Largest one so far is \$3186.00. There was a conflict between two teams but a crisis was averted. 11 teams had gaming licenses approved, 1 did not as they were too late.

Tournament & Sponsorship – Peewee 2/3 over Thanksgiving, went great.

Atom dev coming along, looking for more teams. Rec has their schedule complete.

Bricklok in January is coming along, as well as Atom A in February.

The Debbie Cooper in March has lots of teams that want to join.

Novice Major requires game numbers and game sheets, minor does not. Coaches seem happy and Brian is helping with the aids. Players are having fun.
- **e)** A team has been in two tournaments, won gold in Comox and lost in Saanich. Has had some issues with parents in the stands at that one.

B1 has lots of volunteers. Richmond tournament they were in a tier 2 division, ended up tied.

B2 attended a tournament in Powell River, lost all four games but was up against tier two teams. Has been put in tier four against teams that it has already beat.

C1 is doing well. Waiting to hear about Nanaimo tournament

C2 is doing well. One player withdrew. Attending the Victoria Spring tourney

C3 is hoping to attend the Nanaimo tournament, just waiting to hear back

C4, didn't receive a report but we do have an issue with one parent dropping their child off at 315 for a 430 practice. This can't happen as the coaches are not there that early.

C5 has two tournaments, JDF and Parksville. They are concerns with the league schedule. One withdrawal, two new players.
