Once again this past season we had combined teams with the Waterloo Ringette Association. In Kitchener we hosted the following:

U14AA had a very successful season finishing 3rd overall in league play (10-7-3) and were very competitive in Provincials finishing 5th overall. This was the first year playing AA for most of these young players and throughout the season this team showed great development and success. There were many different associations that came together to make up this group of athletes and they were able to all bring strengths to become a very powerful team. We hope these players bring the experience of this year forward with them as they continue to have very successful ringette careers.

This past season the U16AA team played in a very competitive division finishing 3rd overall in league play (11-5-4). The team faced a couple of challenges losing 2 players just before and throughout the season, but were able to come together and persevere. The team had an amazing run at provincials finishing first after the round robin games and heading into semi finals. After a very hard fought overtime loss in the semi finals against Richmond Hill, they finished 4th overall. This team should be very proud of their development and perseverance throughout the season. We wish luck to all players staying at U16 and those moving up to U19 as well.

The U19A team played in a very large GLRL division of 13 teams and were very successful finishing 4th overall (10-6-4). This is an amazing accomplishment for these athletes and the team should feel very proud of this success. The team qualified for provincials and faced some very difficult teams. The team had great success this season on the ice and finished the season feeling proud of their accomplishments.

Next season Kitchener will be hosting U16AA, U19AA (in combination with Guelph Ringette Association) and U14A.

We thank all our provincial coaches for the amazing and tireless work they put into the athletes on their teams and I congratulate our rep teams on their amazing success that they had this past season.

REGISTRAR'S REPORT

The 2023-2024 season turned out to be a great full season with tournaments, clinics and other great activities for our association

Registration:

KRA saw a total of 216 KRA home association players and 60 staff registered.

8 players subsequently withdrew for various reasons.

25 players were released to another association for the season,

21 players transferred into KRA

Clinics saw a total of 65 registered players.

13 goalie clinic, 14 prep for rep, 18 power skating, Laurier clinic's 8 clinics- 176 total

Laurier PD camps- Nov 13, 36 players, Jan 19, 28 players

Going forward, we will add Ringette Ontario insurance and membership fees as a secondary charge at registration and this will be added to our players' association fees. This will come across as an increase to KRA fees, while it's a combination of our fees and Ringette Ontario Insurance/membership fees.

2022-2023 Carry-forward Credits

Thankfully RAMP's account credit system is working properly and many members were able to use their outstanding credits for Springette registration. Any KRA members who still have credits will see them automatically applied against your fall registration.

Credit Refunds

Any family can request their credit to be refunded by their method of payment at any time if you do not wish to retain this credit. There is a \$5.75 charge for e transfer refund and there is also a 3% fee for credit card refunds. These fees cover our associated fees from the bank and/or credit card provider.

Credit Card Surcharge

Players registered will have noticed a 3% surcharge for credit card payments. This will continue going forward to help recover the processing fees charges by our provider. E-transfer payment is ALWAYS welcomed, and encouraged, and does not have this surcharge. Just remember to include the NAME of the player. E transfer payments are manually updated in RAMP by our treasurer so will not show on your account immediately.

COACHING DIRECTOR REPORT

The 2023-2024 season saw a number of new volunteers entering the coaching ranks for the association, bolstering our staff of returning coaches. KRA continued to host a full slate of regional teams, as well as both AA and A level teams, and we were in the fortunate position of having seven fully qualified female head coaches among our twelve teams. Once again, our coaching applications for the 2024-2025 season were completed and submitted using our online form.

At the provincial level we had three teams hosted in Kitchener this year: U14AA, U16AA, and U19A. All teams were equipped with coaches that had significant experience in ringette as either a player, coach, referee, or all three. These teams were a joint effort with Waterloo and coaching selection was done cooperatively between the Kitchener Coaching Director and Waterloo Coaching Director, with interviews being held by a joint committee consisting of members representing each association.

The KRA was also able to contribute to the hosting of three provincial teams in Waterloo: U19AA, U16A, and U14A. As with the Kitchener hosted teams, coaching selection was a joint effort and saw many qualified and experienced coaches filling these positions – some of whom were previous KRA coaches taking positions in Waterloo. The coaching staff is continuing with our focus of developing our players, and striving to have everyone happily return to KRA next year.

In addition to the Provincial teams hosted, we were incredibly fortunate enough to be able to host at least one regional team at every level, including hosting two at both U12 and U19. Some incredible coaches returned with us this season to coach our regional teams. We also had some volunteers step up and move into coaching positions where we were struggling to find some, despite the fact that finding new volunteers has become increasingly difficult over the past several seasons. A renewed focus on growing our sport, and the Fundamentals level of play, will bring new challenges; but those that we are well situated to deal with effectively. We had some incredibly successful teams within our association at 2024 Regionals, and are working hard to ensure that our coaches have the necessary support to see that the success continues.

In total, we had roughly 60 volunteers in coaching and support positions within our association this season. Surveys were released to membership in December and April, in order to provide feedback on the coaches and the association. These survey results have been reviewed, and summaries distributed to coaches, giving the opportunity to provide valuable feedback to our current coaches and allowing commentary to be provided to our coaching committees. This information is invaluable in assisting with coach selection for the 2024-2025 season. Furthermore, this feedback will continue to be provided to our existing coaches in order to help in their growth as coaches, and to help ensure we are providing our membership with the best coaching we can.

EVENTS COORDINATOR REPORT

KRA events are a way to celebrate with existing players and families, and also an opportunity to bring new people into the sport. If you came to an event this year, I hope you had fun.

This is my second year on the board running events. Last year we reintroduced a Winter Party and Player Appreciation Pancake Brunch, and both were great successes again this year with over 100 players and families at each event. One way we show our appreciation to the players is by awarding pins for 5, 10 or 15 years playing with KRA. We had 14 players receiving 10yr pins this year, and 34 receiving 5yr pins. Special mention goes to **Laura Saunderson** who received her 15yr pin this year.

Team photos were the biggest challenge for events this year. Thank you all for your patience and understanding as we tried to get team photos and individual orders sorted. We will be using a different photographer for next season.

One important goal for Events this year has been to attract more kids and families who are new to ringette. We hosted additional Come Try Ringette events (2 in September 2023, 1 during the Winter holidays, and 1 in Spring). Attendance at Come Try Ringette has been growing and the April event saw 60 kids registered and 45 on the ice. We also spent a day at King Edward School running 30min introductions to ringette in the school gym. This proved successful, adding new players in January and helping with recruitment for the Winter and Spring Come Try Ringette events.

Bringing new kids and families to ringette will be the primary goal for next season.

Lastly, all the events rely heavily on the time, energy and enthusiasm of KRA volunteers - a huge thank you to all of you who helped out this year. We couldn't do it without you.

- Re-started advertising in the City of Kitchener Active Kitchener guide, starting with the Fall 2023 program. Contracting with a local graphic designer to professionally create this work.
- Application for funding from WRRA for marketing support for print ads, and for sticks for new players.
- Continued to advertise on Facebook and Instagram for Come Try Ringette events. We have had good success with this approach to advertising, and it seems to provide good value for money spent.
- We hope that the membership has enjoyed seeing what all the KRA teams are up to on social media and we appreciate your contributions. Coaches, managers, and parents are instrumental in ensuring that action photos/videos are shared on the main KRA accounts, so please feel free to DM them to those accounts during tournaments, games, other team events.

In conclusion, marketing is progressing well, but as always, there is more to be done. Other possible ideas for the future include restarting gym ringette, enhanced merchandise procurement, sharing gym ringette kits with interested schools, as well as continuing to refine our traditional forms of advertising, such as flyers, bulletin boards, etc.
