Looking forward to the 2023-2024 season, there are some areas on which KRA will need to focus their efforts. One of the areas is player recruitment and growth. Recruitment of players at the younger age groups is critical to the growth of our sport and organization. Please do your best to promote ringette with your friends and family, encourage people to attend one of the Come Try Ringette events at their local association. Another area on which KRA will have to concentrate is volunteerism. Volunteerism seems to be on the decline, however, without volunteers, KRA cannot run efficiently. This past season we were not able to ice all of the teams that we had hoped for due to lack of volunteer coaches. We ask that you consider volunteering your time with KRA to help us continue to provide the opportunity for all players to play the sport they love right here in Kitchener!

PROVINCIAL CONVENOR'S REPORT

Once again this past season we had combined teams with the Waterloo Ringette Association. In Kitchener we hosted the following:

- U14AA, coached by Meghan Pearse
- U16AA, coached by Mel Norris
- U19A, coached by Jennifer Crane

Meanwhile, Waterloo hosted the following combined teams:

- U14A, coached by April Bates
- U16A, coached by Laura Tunstall
- U19AA, coached by Kenzie Taylor

The U14AA had a very successful season finishing 2nd overall in league play (14-3-3) and winning a silver medal on Provincials, earning a place at the Eastern Canadian Ring Championships in Dieppe, New Brunswick. While the team did not have the success on the ice at Eastern that they were hoping for, fun was had by all and it was an experience these young players will carry with them throughout the rest of their ringette careers.

This year the U16AA played in a very competitive division finishing the season with a 5-15 record. At provincials that had great success finishing with a 3-3 record, losing in the Quarterfinals. The players gained a lot of experience playing tough opponents that will serve them well as some move up to U19, and returning players become the veterans and mentors for the U14 players moving up.

The U19A team played in a large division of 12 teams, finishing 8th with a record of 6-13-1. They faced several challenges early on, losing a couple of players, but the team came together and finished the season feeling proud of what they accomplished.

Next season Kitchener will once again host joint U14AA, U16AA, and U19A teams, while Waterloo will host our U14A, U16A and U19A teams.

Tryouts have been completed for the AA teams and the teams declared, with U19A tryouts underway. Starting in the 2023/2024 season U12A will become part of the regional program.

I congratulate our rep teams and all KRA rep players on a great 2022/2023 season and I look forward to seeing even greater results from the KRA teams for the 2023/2024 season.

REGISTRAR'S REPORT

The 2022-2023 season has returned to a normal as could be expected year with regular games, practices, tournaments, and year end breakfast.

Registration:

KRA saw a total of 240 KRA home association players and 67 staff registered.

8 players subsequently withdrew for various reasons.

25 players were released to another association for the season,

21 players transferred into KRA

Clinics saw a total of 65 registered players.

11 goalie clinic, 12 prep for rep, 17 power skating and 25 for June power skating

2022-2023 Ringette Ontario added on their insurance and membership fees as secondary charge at registration, but going forward into 2023-2024 this will be added to our players' association fees. This will come across as an increase to KRA fees, while it's a combination of our fees and Ringette Ontario's insurance/membership fees.

2022-2023 Carry-forward Credits

Thankfully RAMP's account credit system is working properly and many members were able to use their outstanding credits for Springette registration. Any KRA members who still have credits will see them automatically applied against your fall registration.

Credit Refunds

Any family can request their credit to be refunded by their method of payment at any time if you do not wish to retain this credit. There is \$5.75 charge for etransfer refund and there is also a 3% fee for credit card refunds. These fees cover our associated fees from the bank and/or credit card provider.

Credit Card Surcharge

Players registered will have noticed a 3% surcharge for credit card payments. This will continue going forward to help recover the processing fees charges by our provider. E-transfer payment is ALWAYS welcomed, and encouraged, and does not have this surcharge. Just remember to include the NAME of the player. E transfer payments are manually updated in RAMP by our treasurer so will not show on your account immediately.

COACHING DIRECTOR REPORT

The 2022-2023 season was, overall, successful, having overcome some obstacles at the beginning of the season. This season not only saw a number of new volunteers entering coaching positions, but also continued to strengthen our working relationship with Waterloo, creating opportunities to host both AA and A level teams at each level. Our coaching applications were completed and submitted using our online form again this year.

From a provincial perspective we had two AA teams and 1 A team hosted in Kitchener this year - U14, U16 and U19. All teams were equipped with coaches that have a multitude of experience in this sport either as a player, coach, ref or all of the above. These teams were a joint effort with Waterloo and coaching selection was done as a joint effort between the Kitchener Coaching Director and Waterloo Coaching Director with interviews being held by a joint committee with representation from both associations.

We were also able to contribute to the hosting of 1 AA team and 3 A teams in Waterloo – U19, U16, U14 and U12. As with the U14AA, U16AA and U19A teams, coaching selection was a joint effort and we saw many qualified and experienced coaches filling these positions – some of whom were Kitchener coaches, taking positions in Waterloo. We saw great success within our provincial programs, seeing a U19AA National attendance and a U14AA Easterns attendance, speaking to the development of our players.

In addition to the Provincial teams hosted, we were incredibly fortunate enough to be able to host at least one regional team at every level, and hosting two at FUN 3. Some incredible coaches returned with us this season to coach a number of our regional teams. We also had some volunteers step up and move into coaching positions where we were struggling to find some. While we were able to staff all of our teams this season, we did see a challenge with our ability to host a second U14 team at our regional level this year. Despite our best efforts, we weren't able to find a coach to staff a second team, requiring the movement of players to other age groups. It's important to note that without our many coaching volunteers we wouldn't be able to host the teams that we do and we're always looking for new individuals to step into this role. Finding new volunteers for these positions has been increasingly difficult within the last few seasons. Despite our struggles, we had some incredibly successful teams within our regional field at our 2023 Regionals.

In total, we had roughly 60 volunteers in coaching or supporting positions with our association this season. A number of these coaches were equipped with the necessary qualifications needed to coach at the level they were placed in and several successfully completed upgrades to their qualifications.

A coaching survey was released to membership to complete in order to provide feedback on their child(ren)'s coaches. These survey results have been reviewed, giving the opportunity to provide valuable feedback to some of our current coaches and allowing commentary to be provided to our coaching committees to assist in coaching selection for the 2023-2024 season. Further feedback will continue to be provided to our existing coaches using these results.

MARKETING DIRECTOR REPORT

This is my first report as Marketing Director, as I took on the position in October 2022. I am still learning the ropes for what can be a very broad role. Social media is a significant part of our advertising and marketing strategy. It is a way to share our game and grow participation. So as a note, please try and share our posts widely - word of mouth is how new players get attracted to ringette, so tell your friends and family what an awesome time your kids are having!

A few other highlights of the past season:

- Wildcat gear (shirts, hoodies, touques), were sourced and made available for purchase at Play It Again Sports.
- To better support our social media strategy, the Facebook account was revived and merged with our robust Instagram feed. Both platforms are now accessible from the same publishing interface, making it easier to update.
- Going to re-start advertising in the City of Kitchener Active Kitchener guide, starting with the Fall program. Contracting with a local graphic designer to professionally create this work.
- Application for funding from WRRA for marketing support for print ads, and for sticks for new players.
- Worked with Avery Holmes to keep up a steady stream of social media posts. This has resulted in the growth of our profiles, as well as significant increases in engagement. We hope that the membership has enjoyed seeing what all the KRA teams are up to and we appreciate your contributions.

In conclusion, marketing is progressing well, but as always, there is more to be done. Other possible ideas for the future include restarting gym ringette, sharing gym ringette kits with interested schools, as well as continuing to refine our traditional forms of advertising, such as flyers, bulletin boards, etc.
