

Lacombe Minor Baseball Association (LMBA) - Coaching Requirements

Reimbursement

The LMBA reimburses coaches at all levels for the registration fee(s) associated with obtaining the coaching certification required to coach in the upcoming season. Once you have obtained the required certification, please provide proof of the certification along with the registration fee receipt(s) to your appropriate LMBA Coach and Player Development Director and you will be reimbursed by the LMBA.

Coaching Requirements Due Date: May 8th

Rally Cap

- 1. Head and Assistant Coaches are required to complete an online course called, **Respect in Sport Activity Leader**. You can access the course by clicking **HERE**. Some of you might have this already from coaching in other sports (eg. hockey).
- 2. Head and Assistant Coaches are required to complete the LMBA Coaches Code of Conduct, it can be accessed by clicking **HERE**.
- 3. Although it is not required by the LMBA, both Head and Assistant Coaches are encouraged to take the **Initiation Online Module** and **Initiation Coaches Clinic** offered through Baseball Canada. Further information about these 2 courses can be found under the Rookie (9U) heading below if you are interested as they are required at the Rookie (9U) level.
- 4. A criminal record check is not required by the LMBA for coaches at the Rally Cap level as this is not considered a drop off program.
- 5. Please provide a copy of your Respect in Sport Activity Leader certificate, LMBA Coaches Code of Conduct and registration receipt(s) to the appropriate Division Director by May 8th.

Rookie (9U)

- Head and Assistant Coaches are required to complete an online course called, Respect in Sport

 Activity Leader. You can access the course by clicking HERE. Some of you might have this already from coaching in other sports (eg. hockey).
- 2. Head and Assistant Coaches are required to complete the LMBA Coaches Code of Conduct, it can be accessed by clicking HERE.
- 3. There will be a Rookie (9U) coaches (Head and Assistant) meeting at the end of April. All Rookie (9U) coaches will be notified of this meeting when a date, time and location is determined. This meeting will give you the opportunity to meet fellow coaches, review the Rookie (9U) package including the 1st weeks practice plans and obtain your team's equipment, roster, t-shirts and hats.
- 4. The LMBA requires Head and Assistant Coaches to take the **Initiation Online Module (1.5 hours)** offered through Baseball Canada. Further information about the online module can be found **HERE.** To register for the course, please click **HERE**.

Rookie (9U) (continued)

- 5. The LMBA requires Head Coaches to also take the Initiation Coaches Clinic (4 hours). Further information about this clinic can be found HERE. An overview of the Initiation Coach certification can be found HERE. To register for the course you will need to register for the Initiation Online Module which will then allow you to register for Initiation Coaches Clinic. The online module must be completed before attending an Initiation Coaches Clinic. If you have already completed the Initiation Online Module, please login HERE to register in the Initiation Coaches Clinic. The LMBA has historically hosted an Initiation Coaches Clinic in Lacombe at the end of April / start of May. The online module must be completed before attending an Initiation Coaches Clinic. In this section you answer 4 questions (province, division you're coaching, coaching class A, AA, etc. and your coaching role Head or Assistant). Once you fill this out, it will tell you what coaching certification courses are required and you can click on each type of course for further information.

Mosquito (11U), Pee Wee (13U), Bantam (15U) and Midget (18U) (continued)

- 6. A Criminal Record Check (CRC) / Vulnerable Sector Check (VSC) is required for all Head and Assistant Coaches. If you live in the City of Lacombe you can obtain this from the City of Lacombe detachment. If you live outside of Lacombe, including Lacombe County, you will need to obtain this from a local (Ponoka, Blackfalds) RCMP detachment. The CRC / VSC letter that the police detachment requires can be accessed on the LMBA website under the Coaches tab. A CRC / VSC is required every 3 years (eg. if submitted to LMBA for the 2019 season a new CRC / VSC will be required in 2022). For the years between CRC / VSC submissions, coaches will be required to sign and submit a CRC / VSC Declaration Form which can be accessed on the LMBA website under the Coaches tab.
- 7. Please provide a copy of your Respect in Sport Activity Leader certificate, LMBA Coaches Code of Conduct, CRC / VSC, for Community A level proof of completion of the Initiation Online Module (Head and Assistant Coaches) and Initiation Coaches Clinic (Head Coaches) and registration receipt(s) to your appropriate Division Director by May 8th. Meeting the Competitive AA certification requirements is tracked by Baseball Alberta once the initial rosters have been submitted.
