Re: LMBL Baseball Pitch Count Policy & Tracking Guidance to Host Teams

Hello Community Leaders,

It has been another developing season as we continued alignment of our community league rules with Baseball Alberta. While the LMBL focus remains on fair play and player / coaching staff development we also recognize the natural competitiveness of championship games through consistent interpretation of the game rules.

In preparation for the LMBL Finals Weekend, LMBL recognized some website documents clean up was required to clearly communicate LMBL pitch count policy and provide summary sheet examples to Host Site Coordinators and their volunteers. The intention of this document is to summarise and explain the Baseball Alberta pitch count rules that are used by the Lakeland Minor Ball League for the mid-season and final weekend tournaments, to help coaches understand and follow the pitch count rules. Pitch count rules are taken from the Baseball Alberta Rulebook.

1.0 Why are pitch counts used by Baseball Alberta?

The primary reason for using pitch counts is to prevent arm injuries. Throwing too many pitches increases the risk of a player injuring their arm. Secondary reasons for implementing pitch count limits are to increase competitiveness and to increase player development. When pitch count limits are used, this prevents a team from relying on 2-3 pitchers for all games which will lead to more competitive games. By increasing the number of players that must pitch for a team, this also leads to increased skill development for more players.

2.0 What are pitch count limits and how are they tracked?

There are five pitch count categories / thresholds that determine that amount of rest that is required before that player may pitch again. The number of pitches for each category depends on the age group. When a player falls in a category, they must then have the required rest before being allowed to pitch again.

Player pitch counts are tracked on the “Pitch Count Logbook Game Form”. Each team is tracked on a separate sheet. The player’s name and number are written down and each pitch they throw is marked off. The last pitch of an inning should be circled (this will help with filling out the “Game Summary Report”). A solid diagonal line should be marked after the player’s last pitch of the game. Only pitches thrown will be included in pitch count totals (ie. Automatic balls during intentional walks, balks and pick off attempts do not count as pitches).

3.0 Pitch Count Rules/Categories

The table below shows the pitch count limits and categories that are used for the Lakeland Minor Ball League mid-season and final tournaments. Baseball Alberta Provincial Championship Play Pitch Count rules are used (*except that 11U pitch count limits are increased by 5 pitches*).

Required Rest is defined in “Days” starting at 12:01am and ending at 11:59pm of the next calendar day. This means that there must be the required full calendar days between pitching appearances.

- *Example 3.1: A 13U player throws 40 pitches on Friday. They require one day rest (Saturday) and would be allowed to pitch on Sunday.*
- *Example 3.2: A 13U player throws 40 pitches in a game that ends Friday at 6pm. The team’s next game is Saturday at 7pm and the coach plans to have the player pitch again because it has been more than 24 hours since they last pitched. This would be a pitch count violation as they require a full calendar day of rest (not just 24 hours).*

The maximum pitch count is the daily maximum that a player may throw. The only exception is that pitchers are permitted to finish the batter if the maximum pitch limit has been reached.

- *Example 3.3: A 13U pitcher starts a batter with a pitch count of 83. They throw one ball and one strike and are now at 85 pitches. They are allowed to continue pitching until the at bat is finished but are not allowed to start pitching to another batter.*
- *Example 3.4: A 13U pitcher starts an at bat with 84 pitches. The batter hits a fly ball on the first pitch that is caught and is out. The pitcher is now at 85 pitches. They have reached the daily maximum, must be removed from the game and now require 4 days’ rest before pitching again.*

4.0 Pitching Two Games in the Same Calendar Day

Pitchers are allowed to have two appearances in the same calendar day (provided they do not require rest after the first appearance). The pitcher may only throw up to the daily maximum in the two appearances combined.

If a pitcher requires rest after the first appearance, they cannot pitch again in the same calendar day.

When a pitcher appears in the second game, the official scorekeeper (ie. Pitch counter) should start the flip chart / counter at the number of pitches thrown in the first game. For example, if a pitcher threw 20 pitches in game 1, then the flip chart / counter should be set at 20, when they appear on the mound the second game. Therefore, after their first pitch in game 2, the office scorekeeper (ie. Pitch counter) will flip the count number up to pitch 21.

- *Example 4.1: A 13U pitcher throws 25 pitches in the first game of the day. They are allowed to pitch in the second game of the day as they are in the LOW category and do not require any rest. The pitcher may throw 60 pitches in the second game (effectively, they begin the game at 26 pitches and can pitch to the daily maximum of 85).*
- *Example 4.2: Following Example 4.1, the pitcher throws 25 pitches in the second game of the day. The daily total pitches thrown is 50. The pitcher is in the MEDIUM category and now requires 2 days' rest before they may pitch again.*
- *Example 4.3: A 13U pitcher throws 40 pitches in the first game of the day. They are in the MEDIUM LOW category, require 1 day rest and are not allowed to pitch in the second game of the day.*

5.0 Pitching Two Consecutive Days

Pitching on two consecutive days is perhaps the most challenging interpretation and creates the most questions. Even though it is not specifically stated in the Baseball Alberta Rulebook, if a pitcher is in the LOW category and does not require rest, their pitch count resets to zero at the start of the next day. They may then pitch up to the daily maximum for their age category.

The rule states "A pitcher who has pitched on 2 consecutive days and whose total exceeds the low category maximum allowance will not be able to pitch again on the second day". So, while a pitcher may be entitled to throw to the daily maximum at the start of the day, they will not be eligible to appear in a second game if it violates this rule, regardless of whether they exceeded the low threshold in the first game appearance on day 2.

If a pitcher's Day 1 + Day 2 count exceeds the figure in the pitch count chart (above) for their age division, they require rest as defined by the pitch count chart.

- *Example 5.1: A 13U pitcher throws 30 pitches on Friday. They do not require rest and will be able to throw 85 pitches on Saturday.*
- *Example 5.2: Following Example 5.1, the pitcher throws 20 pitches in the first game on Saturday and leaves the game. Their two-day total is now 50, which exceeds the LOW category maximum. They cannot pitch in the second game on Saturday. The pitcher will also be ineligible to pitch on Sunday, their third consecutive day (see 6.0 Pitching on Three Consecutive Days)*
- *Example 5.3: A 15U pitcher throws 15 pitches on Friday. They throw 15 pitches in the first game on Saturday. Their two-day total is now 30. They are in the LOW category and do not require any rest. They are allowed to throw 80 pitches in the second game on Saturday (for a daily total of 95).*

6.0 Pitching on Three Consecutive Days

Players may pitch on three consecutive days if the first two days combined do not exceed the LOW category threshold. Players must not exceed the three consecutive day limit as defined in the chart (above).

- *Example 6.1: A 13U player throws 15 pitches on Friday and 15 pitches on Saturday. The two-day total is 30 and the player is in the LOW category (does not require rest). They would be able to throw 65 pitches on Sunday (95 maximum pitches for 3 consecutive day rule).*

7.0 Lakeland Minor Ball – Pitch Count Examples

8.0 Baseball Alberta Rules that are not Applicable to Lakeland League

Lakeland Minor Ball League does not have any restrictions regarding pitching and catching in the same game. Therefore, the Baseball Alberta pitch count rules regarding catching after pitching do not apply. However, moving a player to catcher after pitching should be avoided if possible.

Any player on the team who is not overage is eligible to pitch (exception all 18U players are eligible to pitch including overage), and there are no restrictions to the number of pitchers a coach may use in a game. A pitcher who is removed from the mound during a game shall not be permitted to return to pitch in the same game, no exceptions. Pitchers will be permitted to finish the batter or the inning, whichever comes first, if the maximum pitch limit has been reached.

The official scorekeeper will calculate the total pitches thrown for that calendar day and determine the required rest starting the next calendar day. The official scorekeeper will inform the umpire of the pitch count when a count is nearing the end of a pitcher's daily limits. The umpire will then notify the team coach of the pitcher's team so that an opportunity for assignment correction may be immediately implemented.

Baseball Alberta has specified the maximum number of pitches that a player may throw over four days. These maximum numbers only apply to four-day tournaments and do not apply to Lakeland Minor Ball League weekend tournaments. However, new in 2025, Baseball Alberta has imposed the 3 consecutive day pitch count limit rules that will apply to the LMBL weekend tournaments. In keeping with the motion to increase 11U pitch count by 5 pitches, the 11U – 3 consecutive day limit has also been increased by 5 pitches.

Host Site Coordinator are required to post team / player pitch counts during the weekend play. We trust that this provides some additional information to assist with the LMBL pitch count policy. We'll continued do the best we can, so please have fun filled games, with outstanding sportsmanship and fair play!

Appendix 1: Baseball Alberta Pitch Count General Rules

PITCH COUNT GENERAL RULES

- Any player on the team is eligible to pitch, and there are no restrictions to the number of pitchers a manager may use in a game.
- Pitchers shall be permitted to have 2 appearances in the same calendar day. If a pitcher requires a rest following 1st appearance, they cannot return in the same calendar day (see examples below).
- Pitcher cannot pitch 3 consecutive days unless a pitcher's first 2 days combined does not exceed:
 - 11U – 20 league/25 provincials
 - 13U – 25 league/30 provincials
 - 15U Boys/Girls – 30 league/35 provincials
 - 18U – 30 league/40 provincials
- If a pitcher's Day 1 + Day 2 exceed the figure above for their division, they require rest as defined in the pitch count chart. Pitcher's cannot pitch 4 consecutive days.
- A pitcher who has pitched on 2 consecutive days and whose total exceeds the low category maximum allowance will not be able to pitch again on the second day.
- The official scorekeeper will calculate the total pitches thrown for that calendar day and determine the required rest starting the next calendar day. Athletes must not exceed the maximum pitch count total for that day.
- Once a player assumes the position of pitcher, they cannot catch for the remainder of the game.
- If a player pitches in the first game of the day and is eligible to pitch again in the same day, he may pitch or catch in the second game, but not both.
- Pitchers will be permitted to finish the batter if the maximum pitch limit has been reached.

SURPASSING THRESHOLDS WITHOUT DAYS OF REST REQUIREMENT EXPANSION

This rule will apply to the AAA League regular season and Provincial Championships for all AAA age groups in 2025. When a pitcher reaches the maximum number of pitches allowed for a threshold (See Pitch Count Table), they can complete the earlier of the (i) the end of the at-bat or (ii) the end of the inning, without penalty on days of rest, as long as he/she does not pitch to another batter. The number of pitches corresponding to the threshold reached will be indicated on the pitching log. The coach or manager needs to acknowledge this to the umpire at the moment prior to the next pitch. The umpire will notify the scorekeeper of the threshold.

- Required Rest shall be defined in "Days" starting at 12:01am and ending at 11:59pm of the next calendar day.
- If a game continues past 12:01am, those pitches are counted as if the pitched prior to midnight. If a game is suspended, when it resumes it is defined as a different day.
- A pitcher who is removed from the mound during a game shall not be permitted to return to pitch in the same game, even if the pitcher is retained in the game at another position.
