c. Referee Courses

- Enough interest is shown for both entry-level and conversion courses
- Josh will reach out to Cold Lake to line up dates for back to back courses sometime in October
 - Refresher course will be booked in Bonnyville
- Entry-level is for anyone 16 years and over who would like to take the referee course
- Those who would like to referee an indoor season will need the entry-level course and the conversion course
 - If you've previously completed both, a refresher course only is required

d. Coaching Courses: (See Appendix II)

- Asked ASA for an exemption for on field courses for the indoor season
 - Received the exemption
 - Will need to determine what this would look like for provincials for those who do not have the completed training
- If anyone is looking to book courses (online) then we can look to make those happen
- Reminder regarding the new SQS standard where coaching requirements are now split between community and competitive
 - Community is defined as U11 and below that are not leaving the district
 - **Competitive** is defined as U13 and above or U11 or below that are leaving the district for games
 - See Appendix II for specifics

Discussion:

- St. Paul: will the coaches for the U11s participating in league be considered competitive
- President: the U11s are not participating in league, they will have games scheduled but outside of league play; their standings are not posted. We consider these 'mini tournaments'. So, as long as they're not leaving the district they will not be considered competitive.

5. New Business:

- a. League Schedule
 - If teams are in by October 15th, the schedule should be completed and on the website by October 25th, 2023
 - First games should be expected for the 4th and 5th
 - Five separate weekends have been booked
- b. <u>Combined Communities Form</u> (see <u>Appendix III</u>)
 - Located on LDSA's website (LDSA>Administration>Forms and Documents>Fillable Forms)

- To be completed for teams that have players registered with more than one community
 - Submitted to the district
 - Used for billing purposes and to ensure communities are having discussions regarding fees (i.e. tournament, jerseys, etc.)

c. Player Cards & ASA Rosters

- This is a change
- Requirement for every team leaving the district to have player cards
 - This change stems from an incident involving a coach adding a non-registered player to their roster for an out-of-district tournament who got injured resulting in insurance and ASA getting involved.
- Provide the Executive Director a minimum of 5 days notice prior to roster submissions and player card requests
 - RAMP has a feature that enables player cards to be uploaded to each registration (done at the point of registration by parents/players)
 - a. After registration, the community can request the photo and upload it to RAMP from their end
 - Alternatively, send ED player and coach photos along with the roster
 - a. Noteworthy: it is more efficient to have one or two emails that include all photos vs an email for each photo
- Currently, there is not a fee for the digital cards however there may be an added cost in the future
- Reminder, rosters must be signed by the coach, community and the district when leaving the district

d. League Play

i. We are making a solid attempt to have a co-ed, non-competitive adult house league Lakeland District Soccer Association General Rules for Senior/Adult Indoor House League

LDSA website>Administration>Rules and Regulations

- Want an adult league, especially for those who are aged out
 - Nothing in this league determines provincials
- If more than one club wants to declare a team for provincials then we'd have to do a playdown outside of this league
- Require all players to be registered with clubs, not the district
 - If a club does not have an adult league then they can direct the player to another community
- Anyone 16 years and up can register for the Adult Team
 - i. Youth ages 16 19 can register for both the U17/U19 level in addition to the Adult league
 - 1. Those who do not wish to register for the adult league can be guest players
- Due to being co-ed, there will be minimum requirements regarding the number of females on the roster and on the field of play at all times

Guest player rules do not apply to female players

i. Unlimited guest players for females

Discussion:

- Cold Lake: what are the rules regarding referees, is there an age restriction on how old you have to be in order to referee one of these games?
- President: there's no official rule at this time, but we wouldn't want a youth ref heading these games. They would be permitted to sit in the box though.
- Bonnyville: what is the feeling regarding the adult drop-in groups, is there a sense that they will be open to the league concept or that a drop-in group will continue?
- BV: There seems to be a gap between who will be willing to convert to the registered adult league because there was an understanding that it wouldn't be a competitive league.
- Pres: There has been conversations indicating some adults would be interested in both dropin and league play, which may cause facility issues if they are looking to practice regularly.
- Pres: If there are slots available during scheduled game days we may look to book some adult league games for those days.

Coaching Education Minimum Standards

All member organizations (clubs and academies) that offer youth soccer programing in a Canada Soccer Member Association Province and Territory will be required to meet the minimum Standards of Quality Soccer to be recognized as Quality Soccer Provider within the Canada Soccer Youth Club Licensing Program and in support of the guiding principles of the Safe Sport Roster. Within the Standards for Quality Soccer, it is required that coaches are trained and/or certified appropriately for the program(s) in which they coach and aligned to the Canada Soccer Safe Sport Roster. The minimum standards are further defined below.

- 3. Bench Parents will be required to obtain Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Screen.

Notes for U11 season: we will be incorporating the U11s into the league weekends although they are not fully considered playing in "league" because we do not track scores or standings at this level.
 Since we do not post standings, in an effort to curb competitiveness and "bad behaviour" (most often from coaches), as agreed upon tonight - we will not use the scoreboard to display scores at this level. The scoreboard will be used to record the time clock.

- U13 Boys have 6 teams
 U13 Girls have 5 teams (providing no U13 girls are needed at the U15 level for some communities)
 U15 Boys have 3 teams
- U15 Girls awaiting more information from clubs on potential recruits or move-ups estimating 1 team
 U17 Boys have 2 teams

 Players should be encouraged to also register and play in the adult league as they are eligible to do both and still attend provincials with their youth team.

 Adults registration will remain open until October 31st to allow more time to collect names, finalize details etc. The hope is to have 40-50 adult players join in order to put together an in-house league for the season. Hope to schedule some games on the youth league weekends where possible.

*The Combined Community form will be finalized soon and sent to all communities, and posted to the website. Any team that is combining communities will be asked to fill out the form to ensure all communities are on the same page for the season. (A combined community team is defined as a team consisting of players/coaches who are registered in more than one community combining to form one team for the season while retaining those registrations in the individual clubs)
