

Fall Planning Meeting Minutes Telus Team Meeting September 12, 2021 @ 9:30

1. Call to Order: 9:33 am

Roll Call: Those in attendance: Josh Phillips (LDSA President, BV Tech. Dir.), Cheri Wolgien (LDSA 1st VP), Darlene Larocque (LDSA Secretary, BV VP), Jose Teixeira (LDSA DRA, BV Pres.), Kristin Ward (Vermillion Pres.), Tim Urlacher (CL Pres.), Lori Midford (CL VP), Jolaine Howrish (CL Youth Boys Director), Etienne Vaillancourt (LLB VP)

- 2. Additions to Agenda: Add FUN FEST topic to Unfinished/Ongoing Business section. Discussion lead by Tim Urlacher.
- 3. Approval of Agenda: 1st Cold Lake, 2nd Bonnyville
- 4. Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes: 1st Vermillion, 2nd Bonnyville
- 5. Unfinished/Ongoing Business/Reports:
 - a. Financial Update: Provided by Cheri.
- Coach grant received from ASA will be distributed to all participating communities accordingly: (See appendix ii)

- Government grant received with reporting required on how the funding is to be/has been utilized. President and VP reported back indicating the funds are to be used to ensure the ongoing viability of the organization, noting the funding of an Executive Director.
- Previous outdoor fees are still being collected, there was confusion regarding the amount due as a result of the changing fees with COVID. This has been clarified and fees are expected shortly.
- > Outdoor fees haven't been charged by ASA as yet.
- Net Income is \$28,597.24 with a current bank balance of \$34,317.26
 - b. Executive Director: Provided by Josh.
- Noted that although LDSA is more financially sound, that it may not be the best time to hire an Executive Director due to the ongoing uncertainty of the indoor season's participation and that having a full time ED at this time could place us in a financial predicament if player registrations are quite low.

- Propose a salary of \$1500/mth to be paid to Cheri Wolgien, who has been acting as the interim executive director, over the next 4 months. This will cover the uncertain time-period allowing for further financial stability, management of the ED duties (appx. 200 hrs of work), and time to finalize the Executive Director role/duties, Salary.
 - o All board members in agreement with interim proposal
- Executive Director to ideally be in place by January 2022
 - c. Fun Fest: Provided by Tim.
- Would like to host an outdoor Fun Fest for the U13 U19 age group of Sunday, September 26 from 11-2
- The intention of the festival would be to help determine number of players per age group within the district for the upcoming season.
- Understand that not all registrations are closed by this time, propose that players that were either registered for the past outdoor season and/or registered with the upcoming indoor season be the focus group.
- > Noted the City of CL has a waiver that could be used for non-registered players; like a drop-in
 - VP & Pres. Confirmed that all past outdoor players would still be insured and that as soon as a child registers they are considered insured by ASA.
 - BV suggested having a registration table at the event for 'non-registered' players to be able to sign up
 - Agreed by all to have a registration table at the event for all communities to be able to register players to their clubs as applicable
- > CL will send out communication to all communities regarding the details of the event.
 - d. COVID update: Provided by Josh.
- > ASA restrictions, although lightened, are still in effect.
- > An update is expected soon.
- Risk Waiver must be signed by all: coach, player, ref, etc.) Pres. Had sent the template to all communities
- > Contact tracing logs to continue: templates are available on the ASA website
 - ASA may contact us regarding a positive case and we would need to use this log to contact other close contacts
- > Health Checks are no longer mandatory however communities can continue them if they wish
 - If someone is experiencing symptoms they are not permitted on the field, practice, game. They
 will be asked to leave
- > Follow the facility guidelines/protocols regarding COVID restrictions
 - $\circ \ \ \,$ i.e. masks mandatory in the facility, but not on the fields
 - o spectators at events
- Players and coaches must be 2m away from referees
- Coaches: training is not required at this time however the need to have 2 coaches on the bench for all practices and games is still in place (and will remain in effect post COVID)

- Each gender must be represented (i.e. co-ed team must have 1 female and 1 male coach at all times)
- > Open to travel for tournaments, provincials, and league games
- Sanitizing to continue
- > Masks: Pres to verify whether the coaches are required to wear them on the fields
 - e. Referee Update: Provided by Jose.
- > There are no referees at this time
- > No communities have requested to book referees
 - CL asked if communication could be forwarded to the High School students regarding this opportunity. It would assist with their volunteer requirements as well.
 - Agreed that would be a good idea, anything to raise interest
 - Lori noted she would draft a communication and forward to the communities to share with their High Schools
 - Would be good to have some 'older' referees to mentor the younger/newer refs
 - Lori also noted she would speak with the CL Pres regarding communicating the opportunity with the Men's Soccer group
- Referee Ages:
 - Mini Refs are 12 yrs and older, born after May 15
 - Youth Refs are 14 yrs and older
- > Cost: typically the communities have covered the cost of the referee fees
- Training Courses: <u>https://albertasoccer.com/referee/become-a-referee/</u>
 - An Introduction Course is needed which consists of an online instructor led course (2.5 3 hrs) and an on the field trainer-led session (3hrs).
 - A Conversion course is also needed for the indoor season. This consists of an online sessions
- > Referees can receive the following per game during an indoor season:

- Mileage will be paid to referees when travel to other communities is required, unless they are at the event with a sibling that is participating at the event
- > BV noted they will set up an introductory session on either the 1st or 2nd week of October.
 - o Further details will be communicated to the communities

6. New Business

a. League Play:

- Will wait for the Fall Operational Meeting to discuss once registrations are closed and final numbers are in
 - Question asked to the floor regarding the community interest in having the U11 participate in League Play
 - Tabled until the Fall Operational Meeting once final numbers are available
- > Vermillion noted they will not operate during the indoor season as they do not have a facility to use
 - VP asked if players would be willing to travel to other communities and play for them (register with another community)
 - Vem. Noted they haven't had seasons for almost 2 years and is concerned with the ongoing interest however will continue to communicate and pass along opportunities through social media, etc.
- > Pres. noted it would be good to have the men's team register within the applicable communities as well
 - \circ $\,$ This will allow games between the U19 and the men's teams
 - Lori will look into interest for a Women's team as well
- > St. Paul's indoor season is unknown at this point
- Vegreville is sending kids to Sherwood Park for the indoor season
- LLB numbers are slim at this time
 - b. EIYSA Team
- > Looking to register a Tier 2 team with Edmonton's League.
 - Past examples were quite successful
 - \circ Deadline to register with EIYSA is September $26^{th} 28^{th}$
- Players looking to participate with the T2 team must have registered and be actively participating with their home community
 - This stipulation is to ensure community soccer is protected
- > Currently it is a U17 boys that are looking to form a team
 - The district is open to more teams forming a higher tiered team however this is dependent on the availability of coaches, who are ultimately responsible for the management of the team
- Coaching applications are typically submitted with their qualifications and selected from there
- > Try-Outs are open to all players registered within the district
- COVID restrictions: to be pro-active, how will the competitive team deal with cohort restrictions if they are reinstated?
 - Motion: Community soccer takes precedence, if the cohort permits switch off of teams after a cooling period then the child could switch between the two teams for the duration of the restriction/season, however if only one cohort is permitted, the community team will take precedence.
 - o 1st BV, 2nd LLB
- Pres. will connect with Tara, who is looking to form the team and advise of the board decision to go ahead with try-outs, coach applications, and community communications

c. Registration Deadlines & Process

- > BV, LLB, and CL's registrations all close by September 30th
- Communities to forward their registration numbers to the district within the first two weeks of the close of registration
 - o Interim ED will forward the template to all the community registrars
 - o Ensure to note the CRC expiry and NCCP numbers for all coaching staff
 - For the past outdoor season, if it was missing please forward this information by next week – let your registrars know of the deadline

d. Coaching Courses

- > ASA is still offering coaching courses for free
- > Interim ED had sent out a reminder email last week
- A great opportunity for all communities to take advantage and have their coaches take these courses which they'll get reimbursed for
 - Reminder, it will be mandatory for all coaches to have these courses once SQS is in effect

e. ASA Fall Meeting October 22 – 23

- > Josh and Cheri will be attending the ASA meeting virtually
- Pres. reminded the communities to let him know if the presidents are wanting to attend as well, so that he can register them

f. SQS

- SQS = Standards for Quality Soccer
- > All clubs will have to meet these standards in order to remain in good standing with ASA
 - If non-compliant, the community/club will not be able to participate in provincials or tournaments
- > CSA is enforcing this for all provinces > Provinces for all Districts > Districts for all Communities
- Comes into effect during Fall 2023 (or Spring 2023 the time keeps changing)
- > 37 Standards are to be met
 - Some are quite simple and are already in place
 - \circ $\;$ Others will take some time to create and become established
- It is still unclear if all the standards are to be met by day 1
 - \circ $\;$ ASA has a person in place to support this transition
 - Communities agreed to form a committee amongst the district and communities to support each other in this task
 - To share wording, procedures, etc.
 - The district will look to other districts for sharing of policy framework and support as well
