Lakewood Registration Numbers for Indoor 2023-24

We are still finalizing team numbers for U17 and U19 teams and individual player registrations continue to trickle in. As of September 12, we are at 46 Lakewood teams and 478 Lakewood players compared to 33 teams and 408 players for indoor 2022-23. These 46 teams are 30 boys teams and 16 girls teams. We will get final numbers over the next two weeks, but it looks like registrations have increased in all 5 SYSI soccer zones. This is great news for the local soccer community!

The U17 and U19 players have the option to try out for positions with the Alliance Academy training group. These groups train together and play games as a group and do not play in the Alliance league. They register directly with SYSI and do not register with the zones so these registration numbers are not included in zone registration numbers. These Alliance Academy U17 and U19 groups will be finalized over the next few days and this could impact Lakewood registration numbers for those 2 age groups.

Lakewood Indoor Season Preparation

Many of you would have been involved with player evaluations over the last 2 weeks. We conduct evaluations for U11, U13 and U15 players so that we can place them on teams

and in the divisions where they will be playing with and against players of similar ability. This process will be fine-tuned over the next 1-2 weeks during pre-season training as we release team rosters. We will have pre-season training from September 11 until October 13 at Sid Buckwold Park (weather dependent) and we will move to indoor training on October 14 to get ready for the start of games on October 22. This pre-season training also helps us to form teams with the U7 and the U9 age groups. Our main priority with U7 and U9 teams is to have players grouped with friends because these are non-competitive teams.

We will bring back our GK Academy for the indoor season led by coaches Victor and Bruno. This will start at Sid Buckwold on September 30 and move indoors starting October 14 for a total of 14 GK training sessions. Information is here: http://lakewoodsoccer.com/content/keeper-academy

Spotlight on Technical Staff: Cedric Michelet



Cedric's connection with Lakewood Soccer runs deep. Lakewood was where Cedric first learned to play the game, a joy he now shares with the players he coaches.

Cedric began coaching with Lakewood Soccer in 2018. In the five years that have followed, Cedric's involvement with the club has been exten-

sive. Recently, much of Cedric's time with Lakewood has been focused on a promising group of U13 Boys players, most of whom will be entering U15 this fall.

As the Boys Technical Lead Cedric's goal is for Lakewood players to develop the three major skills of passing and receiving, dribbling, and shooting in an environment that promotes teamwork and fun. To develop these fundamental soccer abilities Cedric believes that there is no substitute for consistent practice. The secret, he says, is to find ways to modify drills and overall sessions to keep players engaged and appropriately challenged. Among other coaching credentials, Cedric is C-license certified.

As a player, Cedric's time with Lakewood concluded with a 6th place finish at U14 Club Nationals in 2015 with the Lakewood Atletico team. Cedric was a Whitecaps Saskatchewan Academy player from 2014 to 2019. In 2019, Cedric was recruited to play for the University of Saskatchewan Men's Soccer team. He was with the program for three seasons.

Cedric is now entering his fourth year of undergraduate studies at the University of Saskatchewan where he is majoring in finance.






Throwback Thursday: 2015
