YEAR IN REVIEW

There were many unknowns as we entered the 2021-22 season. After essentially losing the
entire previous season, LMHA was cautiously optimistic that things could return to normal for
this season.

- We were fortunate to return to a normal evaluation process with our contracted evaluation company.
- There were a few hiccups along the way as we entered our first season in the EFHL. LMHA will continue to work with the EFHL to improve tiering placement and female only divisions. Overall, the feedback was very positive, with reduced travel being mentioned as the biggest benefit.
- LMHA teams competed in the Quickcard Edmonton Minor Hockey Week. We were selected to
 host 10 games of these games in Leduc. Our teams represented our association well, including
 multiple teams playing in the championship game. We even brought home a few gold medals!
- There were a number of LMHA teams that were extremely competitive in the playoffs this season. LMHA was fortunate to have teams compete in the league championship and even win their way into Provincials.

NEXT SEASON

• The past season proved to be a return to somewhat normal for our association and our members. LMHA looks forward to a new season and new opportunity to grow the love of the game of hockey within our athletes and our community.

- 31 LMHA /NCI female athletes participated in 2022 Alberta Challenge selection camps
- 9 NCI athletes selected to participate in 2022 Alberta Challenge, including 2 from Leduc

- If LMHA does not receive the UNDATED Fundraising/Volunteer cheques by Sept 1, LMHA will not permit your player to be on the ice. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- You are responsible to complete your Fundraising/Volunteer Commitments that you choose from the above list. LMHA will email to remind you of these shifts.
- If you change your email address, it is your responsibility to update your account.
- If you cannot attend the event you signed up for, it is YOUR responsibility to find a replacement (friend or family member). If you fail to fulfill your selected Fundraising/Volunteer Commitments, the players registration account will be charged \$250 for every Fundraising/Volunteer Commitment NOT MET.

Update for 2021/2022 season:

- 16 events completed during the season in additional to all the board members, coaches and managers.
- Volunteer coordinator logged approximately 405 hours over the course of the season.
- We needed just over 4800 hours of volunteers for the 602 kids registered this season. With unfilled hours added in, we had over 4900 hours available to everyone.
- Honorarium for 2021/2022 = \$1000 from Golf Canada event.
- LMHA awards coaches' credits only if they are CARDED properly and first 5 (6 for U7) carded for team. Additional coaches at team expense DO NOT get credit.
- Jersey parents, time clock/scorekeeper for your own team, fundraising for your own team does not count towards your association credits.
