

Frequently Asked Questions Regarding the Black Gold Female Hockey Project 2025

Q: Which Association is Hosting What Divisions?

A: BAHA Surge U9, U11 +, U13, U15A

LMHA U9, U11, U13A & U13AA, U15 & U15AA, U18 & U18AA

Q: What is the process for registering with Leduc Minor Hockey?

A: Beaumont will be collecting player movement forms (PMF) and applying refunds to all Beaumont Players. Beaumont players will then have to register with Leduc.

Q: Will there be a size limit to teams?

A: As we try to accommodate all female athletes wanting to play tiered female hockey, we would like to keep teams to a roster size of 17 (9 fwd, 6 def, 2 g). However, that number may increase or decrease slightly depending on where athletes are placed due to skill.

Q: If an Association is the "Host", what does that entail?

A: The Host Association is the home for that team. They will supply the team name, jerseys's, etc. All home games will be played at the host association. Practices are split between Beaumont and Leduc.

Q: If I have already registered for conditioning camps with my home organization, can I still attend those?

A: Yes. You can still attend the camps in your original home association.



Q: What is the purpose of the U11+ team?

A: The purpose of a plus team is to have more development throughout the season to prepare to make an "A" or "AA" team in U13.

Q: If my child is released from the AA tryouts, do they attend the female tryouts for a spot on a female team?

A: Yes. You are not automatically placed on the A team if you are released from AA tryouts.

Q: if there is not enough room on a Female team, does my child go back to coed?

A: No. You need to be registered with the female program in order to be placed on a female team. We have capped that registration to ensure all females have a place to play on a female team.

Q: What does the level up fee cover?

A: A level up fee will be applied to all +, Tier 1 (A) and AA teams. This will cover costs of extra ice time, referee fees and extended game times. It may also include extra skill development. This level up fee is determined when the season schedule is published from EFHL and development is set.
