## 6. Reports:

# a. Presidents Report - Mike Baker

Thank you to all the board members for the hard work, dedication and support through my first season in this position. Also thank you to the membership as well as we continue to work through challenging situations as we push to grow the association.

Congratulations to all teams in their success this past season and special note to our u16 A team as they had the opportunity to compete at the provincial championships winning bronze after securing the Black Gold championship during the regular season. Also, to our Open A team who also had a great season taking home silver at provincials.

This year the Alberta Winter Games were held in Grande Prairie and we had 4 athletes represented from Leduc. Congratulations to Olivia Bearchell, Mia Conn, Josie Hart, Keira Adam's. Also, we had Kennedy Horn attend as a coach, congratulations!!

We also held our Wild Thing Tournament in January which was a big success. Thanks to Erin McCauley and Kari Baker for your hard work in organizing.

We had the opportunity to host the U16A/U19A/open A provincial championships. It was a great weekend of ringette and a big spotlight of our facilities and Ringette Alberta's trust in our associations abilities to put on a great show. Congratulations goes to Tamara Conn for her vision and her commitment and all the other volunteers to make this event a huge success. We were able to raise approx \$4,000 from this event.

We hosted our first Spring Ringette which we had great feedback and will continue to promote and grow this in the future.

We have some exciting things being planned for the summer and for the 2024/2025 season as we continue our push to promote the sport, growth of ringette and our association to the community of Leduc and surrounding area.

## b. Vice President – Crystal Kardelis

Was a great year. Pictures went smoothly. We will be looking to schedule pictures earlier this year to try and ensure they are received in time for the holiday season.

# . Treasurer's Report - Chelsea Cameron

- Our closing balance for the 2023/2024 season is: \$109,480.11.
- Active goals for the past season were updating our accounting practices to include EFT payments and automatic direct debit/credits. This is ongoing.
- This position will be vacant after this year, and I will assist with the transition.

# d. Ice Allocator's Report - Shauna Paul

- Late June the fall / winter contract was received for 2023-24. Signed contracts are typically due back mid/ late
  July.
- October 2, 2023, emailed was received to request Spring and summer ice for 2024. Due Oct 16, 2023. At that
  time U16 Elite / AA was not happening in Leduc. As of May 31, we do not enough ice to host U16AA Tryouts
  before the Sept long. I am currently working trying to get enough. Both Edmonton and Sherwood Park have
  confirmed they will host Aug 25 29, 2024.

- March 28, 2024, an email was received to submit fall / winter ice for the 24-25 season. This contract should be received no later than July 1, 2024.
- All reschedules must go through LRA Ice Allocator as per BGL rules.
- Only the LRA ice allocator and President can make changes to the LRA contract as per the city rules.
- Teams are not allowed to host Family team skates / games with LRA ice. Should a team wish to have family
  skate or rent a room at the LRC, they are to contact LRC staff and receive a separate contract. Payment will be
  made from the team direct to the city.
- Ice Allocator is required to participate in the annual start up meeting in late Aug every year. Every association is
  required to submit 150% of game ice to BGL by the dates outlined in critical dates. This happens 3 times
  throughout the season.
- With the returned ice, the practices are created. Only a team manager or head coach should be discussing practices or reschedules.
- Teams should be advising a minimum of 5 days in advance if they can not use the ice. When given full ice a
  minimum of 50% of the team should be in attendance.
- U16AA skates now scheduled for Aug 25, 27, 29th.
- AA evaluations need to be complete by September long weekend as per RAB.

#### e. Referee-In-Chief - Kennedy Horn

- The refs had a great season. Everyone was given development opportunities, and many achieved new carding levels. We had many officials that attended provincials and one who attended Western Canadians (YAY Chelseal).
- I am predicting good retention this summer; a survey will be going out prior to registration to gauge actual numbers. The number of refs that return after summer break as well as our final number of teams in the fall, will indicate how many refs we can hire.
- If you, or your child, is interested in becoming a ref next season please send me an email before September at leducringette.refinchief@gmail.com (can also be found on the Leduc Ringette Website). New refs must be at least 14 years old before the day of the clinic. Your reffing "home association" is based on address and not what team you play for. As reffing is a job we will be doing a hiring process, including interviews, around late August/early September. This means: DO NOT register for a level 1 ref course without going through this process. If you do, you will not have an association to ref for and will not get games.
- Question: If a ref lives in Beaumont, can they apply to ref in Leduc?
  - Would need to apply in Beaumont due to paid mileage but we are looking to partner refs with Beaumont.
- f. Registrar's Report JoAnn Stempien
