First year of the U13 AA team playing in the AFHL. They did very well. Under the Elite division of LMHA. They won Provincials.

U13 A – NEAHL

This year we have a U13 A team that played in the NEAHL League. They played in Tier 3. Placed 6th out of 8 teams. 6 wins, 13 losses. Goal Diff of -16. Roster of 16 players.

No complaints from or about this team.

U13 – ECAFHL

Placed 5th out of 6 teams. 3 wins, 15 losses. Goal differential of -67. Roster of 18 players.

No complaints from or about this team.

<u>U11 – Lloydminster City League</u>

First year for U11 girls to play in the U11 Lloydminster City League. Three Female teams.

481 – Placed 4th in the league play out of 8 teams. 14 players

482 – Placed 5th 14 players

483 – Placed 8th 15 players

Team 482 and 483 started the season with no dedicated goaltenders.

Team 482 won the final year end league tournament.

Team 481 lost in the semi-final

Five girls that were enrolled in the mainstream moved over to the female teams once it was decided to play in the City League. This is likely to increase enrollment.

No complaints from or about these teams. Many compliments from the other teams in the league about the level of play the girls brought. Also, added more variety to the city league.

Struggled at the start of the year to get a third head coach.

<u>U9 – Lloydminster Minor City League</u>

Three female teams played in the U9 minor league in Lloydminster. Two teams of 12 and one team of 13.

No complaints from or about these teams.

Other

I am not aware of any discipline action required against any players, coaches or parents on any of these teams.

Goalies is an issue coming out of U9. Parents should know that goalie gear is available. Hopefully bring in more girls that want to play goal.

Moving forward for the U13 division, it is likely we won't have enough girls to make a A team next year unless things change with registration or more out of town girls make the AA team
