BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES:

- ➤ Parent Code of Conduct: Jason T, Sheldon H, Scott D.

 - **❖** *ACTION:* Directors to review and provide input and feedback for next meeting

> Jersey Replacement: Aaron

- Tender letter is drafted and will be shared at the May meeting
- Approx timeline is 6 weeks to receive jerseys following order. Goal is August 1.

> Budget Committee Update: Dean

- Dean is in the final stages of the budget and has received feedback and input from each of the applicable directors
 - o Budgeting process is now streamlined and much cleaner
- Currently sitting at approx. \$110K profit, which is comparable to previous years' budgets. Even at this, we usual end with a deficit on average of \$1K-\$8K per division
 - Based on the budget registration fees can remain the same as previous season for the 2019-2020 season

<u>Motion</u> for 2019-2020 Registration Fees to remain the same as they were in previous season. Scott Forbes. 2^{nd} Crystal Inge. Carried – 12 For, 0 Against, 0 Abstained.

- TeamSnap we have reviewed and determined that although they have some excellent features, there are still a few pieces that need to be ironed out on their end (ie scheduling of officials, out of town players)
 - o We will continue with the RAMP registration system for this season
 - o Discussion will be continued throughout the season with reconsideration for 2020-2021 registration
 - Still have the option to purchase the teams package as many of our teams were using Team Snap for their internal communications and score updates – would work out to \$37/team (vs \$99) if this route was chosen.

City League:

- Survey Results shared and reviewed
 - o Good participation and overall support for the City League

- Consistent concerns that we were already aware of and can easily be rectified moving forward
- **❖** *ACTION:* Aaron to forward results summary graphs to Maryann to post on the website

Motion: To proceed with City League in Atom & PeeWee again for 2019-2020 Dean Segberg. 2nd John Robinson. Carried – 12 For, 0 Against, 0 Abstained.

- ❖ *ACTION:* Dean and John to form a committee to ensure Bylaws are presented for AGM
 - Suggested 2 Directors, Maryann, and 2-3 coaches/managers

Evaluation Process:

• David shared that companies are already getting booked and looking for a commitment

Motion: To move with 3rd party company, All Play Hockey for evaluation of the Atom, PeeWee, and Bantam male evaluations – provided they are supportive of the conditions imposed by LMHA regarding data management, groupings, etc. David Lopez. 2nd Colin Wood.

❖ *ACTION:* Committee (David, Scott, Lana, Aaron, Sheldon) to set date to review terms and schedule a call with All Play Hockey.

➤ Goalie Registration Incentive:

- Colin reached out to some other associations and learned that it various significantly from one to another
 - Should attracting and retaining goalies be an issue in any LMHA this will be evaluated by the board on a case by case basis

NEW BUSINESS:

➤ Board Member Terms Expiring in 2019:

- Dean, Crystal, Kaley
- Drake's place on the executive will also need to be filled at AGM
 - Our bylaws today state that you must have served a minimum of 1 year on the board to sit on the executive committee
- If any other directors are not wishing to fulfill their terms please forward resignation to GM email.

> Ice Fees for wasted ice:

- There is a procedure in place today, however has not been enforced.
 - O How do we hold teams more accountable?
 - Although this ice is budgeted for the city can revoke and designate to another group if we aren't appropriately using our allotments

➤ NEAHL AGM – April 6 – Kaley & Scott Forbes

- Rachel Smyl has stepped down Atom Governor Ryan Small (Cold Lake) – will take her place
- League fees for 2019-2020 season will remain the same
- Communication to and from associations needs to improve.
 - Managers and Coaches should not be communicating directly with the league
- Preseason to determine appropriate tiering will be consistent with last year

 however approach to scheduling will be revisited and potentially look
 more like playoffs where opponents are named and given dates by which
 the games need to be played. A round-robin tournament is not an option.
 - Each association is expected to state whether their teams are "weak or strong" when they submit their teams at the onset of the year
 - Three rounds of preseason prior to final tiering. The last will likely see tier crossover for many teams to determine their competitiveness
 - There is an option to re-tier teams up to 2 weeks following final placement
- Weather Amendment
 - NEAHL will be involved in stating if a team should travel. This
 must be sorted out between the teams. No forfeits are permitted in
 the NEAHL league for any reason.
- Affiliation Numbers expected to follow the affiliation grid that is currently being drafted by Hockey Alberta
- Tier 5 Midget & Bantam will be non-contact for the 2019-2020 season. Associations have the option to declare placement in this league and will remain there whether they are competitive or not.
 - o Safety & player retention are the key reasons
 - Tier 4 teams may be moved to Tier 5, regardless of their desire, if they are not competitive at the Tier 4 level
- Playoff and Provincial Play down Structures
 - Consolation playoff series have always been an option and are at the discretion of the teams involved (to address shorter seasons)
 - Likely that this will follow the PeeWee model from 2018-2019, where the league champ attends provincials. Subject to confirmation from Hockey Alberta at their Apr 26 meeting.
 - Team would need to declare at the onset of the season if they didn't wish to participate in provincials, at which time the 2nd place team would represent.
 - o Bantam & Midget Tiering NEAHL will play in Tier 2, 4 & 5
 - Following completion of regular season, Tier 2 will be split into Tier 1 and 2, based on season results, and playoffs will determine who attends provincials for these Tiers. Tier 4 will be split into Tier 3 and 4, as above.
- No game shall begin with less than 2 officials AND less than 8 players per team.

- If 2 officials and 8 players per team are not present within 30 mins following scheduled game time. The game will be cancelled and rebooked. No forfeits.
 - If game starts late it must still be completed within the allotted ice time (remove flood or run straight time)
 - The offending team will travel back to the opponent's venue of their choice and be responsible to cover all costs of ice and officials for the rescheduled game.

- Continuing to struggle attracting goalies in the female division
- Other associations offer discounts or alternative perks to goalies. Is this something LMHA would consider?
- What we do for the female division, we'd likely need to do across the entire association.
- Colin will do some more research into what others are doing and bring a proposal back to the next meeting for consideration.

 - o Only 25% of yearend budgets have been submitted
 - How/why to enforce
 - More effective to make it mandatory for bank statements to be provided at year end?
 - Question on how to collect on unpaid team fees
 - This needs to be managed at the team level early in the season with a payment plan
