Injury Reporting Procedures

Definition of Injury: Damage to the body resulting from participation in an LMHA/Hockey Alberta sanctioned event, which requires:

- The removal from a game, practice or event and/or
- professional medical services

Definition of Serious Injury: Damage to the body resulting from participation in an LMHA/Hockey Alberta sanctioned event, which requires:

- The removal from a game, practice or event and
- Immediate/emergency intervention of professional medical services.

Note:

- The provision of professional medical services includes but is not limited to services provided by: physician, chiropractor, dentist, nurse, and paramedic/EMT.
- LMHA/Hockey Alberta events include (league games, tournaments, practices, training camps, sanctioned fund-raisers) involving and/or when playing other member (CHA/OTHER Branch) teams only.

Return to Play Recommendation: It is required that players who incur ANY injury (as defined above) obtain a note from a professional medical service provider before they are allowed to return to play.

LMHA/Hockey Canada Injury Report Form: Must be completed for each case where an injury (as defined above) is sustained by a player, spectator or any other person at an LMHA/Hockey Alberta sanctioned event. It is imperative that the form be completed within 72 hours of the injury date and submitted to the LMHA administrator.
