2014-15 Certification Process

FIRST: Pay Registration Fees online. Payment for clinic & membership fees will not be accepted at the clinics. The only money accepted at the classroom clinics will be for supplies (rule books, crests, manuals, etc.). [Clinic Fees](#) [Payment Instructions](#)

THIRD: Complete the required online modules.

All Junior officials will complete the Hockey Canada eHockey modules, and all Senior, Level 4, 5, & 6 officials will complete the SHA Senior online modules.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. How do I get certified?

2. Is transportation available to a clinic?

Yes. As soon as we get the numbers to see how many are going we will book a van and usually we attend the clinic in Kindersley as it has classroom and on ice sessions. If you don't attend that session, then you are on your own and transportation isn't reimbursed.

3. Do you have to pay for the certification?

You pay for it when you sign up online. After you have completed the online process you send your receipt to the referee coordinator. He will then add the amount to the game tracking sheets and refund the cost of the clinic and the registration. Any additional expenses (badges, stripes etc) are at your own expense.

4. Do I have to buy my own referee jersey or are they supplied?

There are jerseys in the ref room that are available. These jerseys are not to be taken home. They are to be hung up in the ref room. These jerseys are periodically washed on an as needed basis. If you have a jersey or want to buy your own you are welcome to, but not mandatory. This would be at your own expense.

5. What equipment do I need?

A black helmet equipped with an approved CSA visor, whistle, black pants (no team logos), shin pads, elbow pads, athletic support cup. A protective girdle is optional.

6. How do I get assigned for games?

Each team has a person who is in charge of getting officials for their games. The MMHA Ref Coordinator will supply them with a list of certified officials and their contacts. They are to track who they have called and try to utilize all refs.

7. How do I get paid?

After each game there is a "Game Sheet" in a binder in the ref room that you fill out and get the coach to sign. At the end of each week the ref coordinator gathers the sheets and tracks the games and individuals who did the games. At the end of the month the coordinator sends the tracking sheet to the MMHA treasurer who then issues a cheque.

8. Is there anyone who is around to help out in case we have questions?

Yes. The MMHA ref coordinator will be periodically watching games to see how you are doing and provide you with feedback on what you are doing well or what you need to work on. As well they will be around to answer any questions you may have
