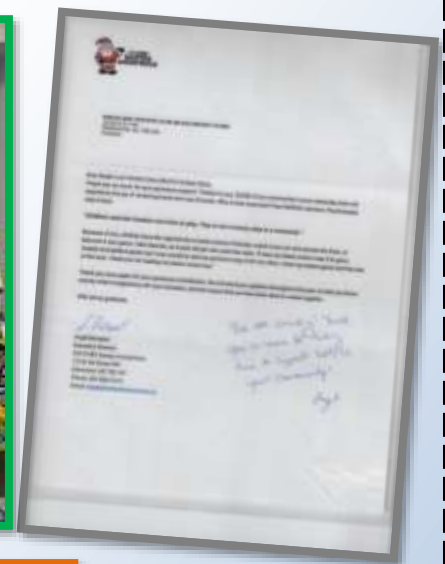


# MLAC SOCIAL DIRECTOR

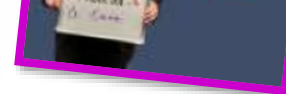
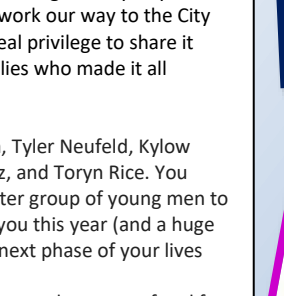
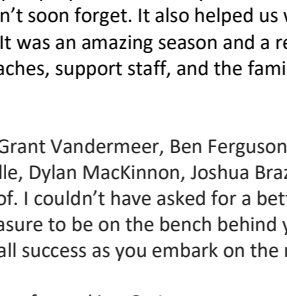
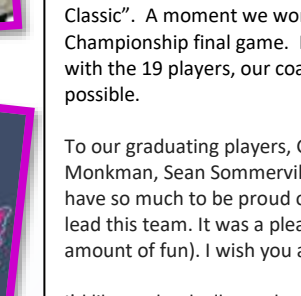
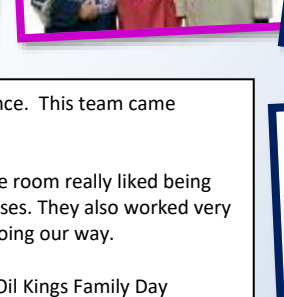
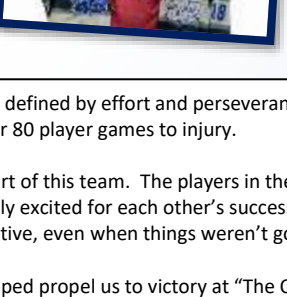
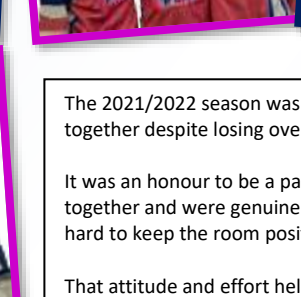
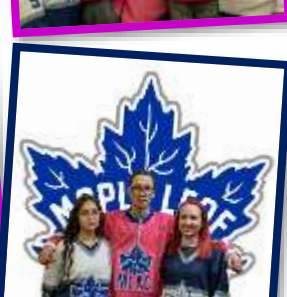












The 2021/2022 season was defined by effort and perseverance. This team came together despite losing over 80 player games to injury.
