
U12 Convenor

Convenors can be used as intermediaries between players/parents and bench staff or between members and the board of directors.


To engage:

- More ice time




Which teams to host

There will be 3 U12 teams:


- U12A
- U12B
- U12C

New policy by ERRA says that we must host one at each level.



Goalies

- Shortage should be expected at U12
- Give opportunities to try
- Those teams without a designated goalie can rotate interested players for the first half.



Call ups -Given team sizes/COVID - very likely

League Rules


- Call from levels below (start with one below)
 - U12A -> U12B, U12C or Fun3 (U10)
 - U12B -> U12C or Fun3 (U10)
 - U12C -> Fun3 (U10)
- No lateral substitutions unless no other options available - requires NCRRL convenor approval
- Can only call the same player 3 times
- Must be indicated on the game sheet
- NCRRL convenor must be notified



Call ups (continued)

MDRA expectations

- Rotation of call ups
- Coaches to communicate with board/convenor regarding who is being called up when



Skills Nights

Background:

- No competitive stream; therefore, no additional ice
- Additional ice created for all regional players

Benefits:

- Focus on ringette skills and positioning
- Led by Allie Marcotte

Parent Code of Conduct (continued)


Ringette Ontario Parent Code of Conduct

- Cooperate with coach, teammates and opponents

Ringette Ontario Athlete Code of Conduct

- Duty to report infractions
- Purpose: To ensure a safe and positive environment
- Covers: Harassment, Bullying and Hazing
- Applies to conduct during ringette activities as well as conduct that affects ringette activities
- Sanctions can be applied




