V.P. SOFTBALL: (Mark Newman)

• 8 teams for 2019 – 1 Mite, 2 Squirt, 2 Novice, 1 Bantam, 1 Bantam Rep, 1 Midget

<u>Mite</u>

- The Mite team was made up entirely of first year players
- They prepared in the winter by learning the rules and getting to know their fellow teammates
- They spent a good part of the season in first place and finished with just 4 losses in an 18 game schedule
- The top 3 teams in the Mite division dominated the other teams. The division was split with the top 3 teams having their own play-offs and the other 6 teams having their own. Majors came up short.

<u>Squirt</u>

• Both our Squirt teams struggled in the standings, finishing in the lower half. They were competitive in most games but cam eup short most nights. They formed an All-Star team that was competitive in the tournament circuit.

Novice

• Both Novice teams were strong, finishing near the top of their division. The division was split for the play-offs with both Majors teams only playing the top team in the division. One team did make it to the final and was winning throughout most of the game only to lose in the bottom of the 7th to undefeated Milton.

<u>Bantam</u>

• Our Bantam team struggled due to lack of pitching, finishing in the bottom half of their division. They were competitive most games, played good defense and hit well, but fell victim to too many walks. The team is enthusiastic and vows to do better next year.

Bantam Rep

• Our first year in Rep went better than expected. I predicted 2-3 wins. The team ended up winning 11 games. They won a play-off game and a bronze medal at a tournament. They gained a ton of experience and improved exponentially as the season progressed.

Midget

- The Midget team finished with a winning record in the middle of the pack. The main struggle was players moving halfway through the season. Credit to those players who drove from Georgetown and Peterborough to attend games when they could.
- The Majors hosted 2 tournaments for Softball. Both Majors teams lost on tie breakers to make it to the medal games but competed well just the same. I believe both the Squirt and Novice teams did go on to win medals the following week at another Association's tournament.
- This coming winter, we will continue with bringing Mite aged players into the gym. It has proven to be very beneficial. We will continue with the OBJ program, our pitching clinic and we have added a winter catcher's clinic to our training line-up
