Moose Jaw Minor Hockey Association (MJMHA) appreciates the dedication of our members and the volunteers who contribute for the benefit of our children. As members, it is our collective responsibility to work together to create a safe and enjoyable environment for all youth and volunteers.

This agreement is intended to help players understand their role in enriching both their own and others' hockey experience.

### **As a player, I agree to:**

- Abide by the rules of hockey, MJMHA policies, and the principles of good sportsmanship.
- Respect all teammates, coaches, team officials, referees, opponents, opposing coaches and officials, and all participants in MJMHA games, practices, and events.
- Never make derogatory comments regarding another individual's race, ethnic origin, color, religion, gender, or sexual orientation.
- Avoid putting others down or saying/doing anything that could cause physical or emotional harm.
- Work hard to improve my skills as both an individual and team player.
- Act in a safe and responsible manner during all MJMHA events, including games and practices.
- Support and encourage my teammates.
- Attend all practices and games. If I have a legitimate reason for being absent, I will notify my coach with as much notice as possible.
- Be punctual and ready to begin practices and games as scheduled by the coach.
- Play the position assigned by my coach to the best of my ability.
- Maintain self-control and not lose my temper during games, practices, or any MJMHA activity.
- Avoid any behavior or activity that could bring embarrassment or disrespect to my team or MJMHA, including smoking, drinking alcohol, or using drugs.
