- Addressing Disrespectful Behavior: The card also outlines what to say if a player, coach, or fan displays disrespectful behavior, helping umpires address these issues calmly and effectively.
- Non-Verbal Signaling: In situations where an umpire feels uncomfortable, they can pull out the card and hold it in the air. This non-verbal cue signals that the umpire is uncomfortable and would like the behavior or action to stop.

It's important to note that not all new umpires will have the confidence or courage to directly confront a player or adult. Therefore, as a coach, it's crucial that you inform your players and parents about the significance of the card and its purpose.

Should a red card be used during a game, it may be followed by a formal report written by the umpire and the Zone Umpire in Chief (UIC). Depending on the severity of the situation, Softball Manitoba may take disciplinary action against the offenders.

Recruiting new umpires can be challenging, and retaining them is often even more difficult. It's essential that, as umpires, coaches, players, and fans, we all play a part in fostering a positive, respectful environment for everyone involved in the game. By maintaining the integrity of the sport and treating all participants with respect, we can help ensure that future generations of umpires feel valued and motivated to continue their involvement.
