



To all Coaches, Assistant Coaches, and Team Managers:

The mandate for the Morinville Youth Basketball Association (MYBA) is to provide a safe, fun, youth-oriented program. We are accountable to ensure we perform our due diligence to provide a safe environment, including mentorship, for youth within the MYBA basketball program.

Vulnerable sector checks were created in 2000 to protect children and vulnerable persons and are governed by section 6.3(3) of the Criminal Records Act.

In accordance with the Alberta Basketball Association Policy (Section 2.3), all volunteers who are caused to have authority over, or trust of children and are directly involved with youth players registered in MYBA must provide a Vulnerable Sector Police Information Check to the MYBA Executive Board. This includes coaches, assistant coaches, and team managers. Since these are volunteer positions, there is no processing fee for the check. Fully realizing that these are volunteer positions, we are requesting your full cooperation. The completed check must be received by the Executive Board (uploaded to RAMP) prior to the first scheduled practice of the season.

Please provide this letter to the Police Detachment who has jurisdiction where you reside to receive your Vulnerable Sector Police Information Check free of charge. Please advise the Police you are volunteering for a youth sports organization in Morinville. You must bring two (2) pieces of government issued I.D.; one of which must be photo I.D.
