



Novice Half Ice Game Report


- Required for all Novice games



4. Regulation updates:

Please ensure that your board members and all team staff read the NAI approved Regulations for changes.

- Inclement weather postponement is very specific and will cost *both* teams now, not just the home team.
- Supplementary discipline kicks in requiring coaches to monitor team and individual penalty minutes.



5. a) Novice updates

5. b) Female update:

We continue to look for more female teams so that we can start female only divisions, but very little to no progress.

We have 1 team that will be playing in PeeWee that is registered as a Bantam team due to 6 overage players.



5. c) Bantam no-hit update

NAI asked associations if they wanted this. We had a number of responses but only 4 responded that they wanted a tier for it - CR Knights, Devon, Slave Lake, and Whitecourt.

We sent out an e-mail for the CR Knights area to see if other local communities could join together. This can be done anywhere, and should be.

Although we would still like to do this, it is not feasible with only a few associations and so spread out.



6. Hockey Alberta Updates:

- Overage criteria is now a regulation with HA, applications must be sent to league President for initial approval. NO Junior to Midget will be considered.
- Provincials will be PeeWee, Bantam, and Midget Tiers 1 - 4 league champions.
- Split tiers will be a reality due to shrinking associations and leagues, with league Presidents meeting in Red Deer in early January to decide cut-off points.
