	Deferred 2022/23 Coach Applications/Evaluations Jeff Roynon Coaching applications will be advertised soon, along with coaching evaluations. Some discussion around a board member collecting the surveys and compiling a summary that is presented at the board level for review. There was further discussion around the coaching evaluations and there was a mix of thoughts around	_



allowing anonymous submissions. Some exec members felt that anonymous submissions created an opportunity for a member to freely criticize a coach. Other exec members felt that removing the anonymous option could potentially create angst between coaches and parents, that could impact team decisions moving forward. Further, it was decided that any evaluations submitted should be received by a non-coach exec member and a summary would then be provided to the exec. Coaches would continue to be provided with all surveys for their own viewing.
