Five years ago, Chad started to do video work with the teams and has enjoyed using this teaching method with the players. The video analysis allows the athletes to take a look at their performance in order to improve their skills. This method catches the small details that are often missed when watching the players live.

When on the ice, Chad's goal is to share his passions, make players feel valued and focus on development both on and off the ice.
