

# Nepean Ringette Association Competitive Team Tryout Evaluation Process 2025

#### 1. Evaluators and Evaluation Process

- A minimum of two evaluators will be assigned to each player.
- Evaluators will assess players using standardized evaluation forms.
- Each evaluator will be responsible for up to 10 skaters on the ice, with the number varying based on evaluator availability.
- Efforts will be made to maintain the same evaluators within an age grouping throughout the tryout process to ensure consistency in that age group.
- Within an age group the evaluators will be assigned different players each session as possible.

## 2. Evaluation Criteria and Scoring

Players will be evaluated in three categories, each scored out of 5:

- 1. Ring Control
- 2. Tactics
- 3. Skating Mobility
- Maximum possible raw score: 15

Goalies will be evaluated in six categories, each scored out of 3:

- 1. Saves
- 2. Ring Distribution
- 3. Positioning
- 4. Mobility
- 5. Rebound Control
- 6. Recovery
- Maximum possible goalie raw score: 18

#### 3. Post-Evaluation Debrief

- Evaluators will meet after each tryout session for a debrief.
- The Competitive Director (or an elected board member if a conflict exists) and the age group convener will be present.
- If a head coach has been named, they will also attend.

- Evaluators will present scores and provide feedback for clarification.
- Significant discrepancies between evaluators will be discussed.

#### 4. Player Ranking and Release Process

- Players will be ranked based on raw scores for that tryout session.
- The lowest-scoring players will be discussed, and a unanimous decision will be made regarding releases after the 1st, 2nd and 3rd tryouts.
- Coaching evaluation and feedback from previous seasons may be used as needed to supplement decision making.
- If unanimity is not reached, the player will be invited to the next tryout.
- Following the 3rd and 4th tryout session raw scores may be combined using a weighted scoring system to re-rank players to assist in determining the lowest scoring players in situations where players are ranking closely together.
- The number of releases after each tryout depends on the total number of participants.

## 5. Weighted Scoring System

• Each tryout session carries an increasing weight:

First Tryout: 10%
Second Tryout: 15%
Third Tryout: 25%
Fourth Tryout: 50%

 Players reaching the final tryout will have four raw scores contributing to their final evaluation.

#### 6. Roster Decisions

- The head coach, in consultation with the Competitive Director, determines the final roster size.
- The final two roster spots do not require unanimous agreement and will be decided by the head coach.

## 7. Player Feedback

Players or guardians may request feedback via email to the Competitive Director.

## 8. Player Positioning

- Players will be evaluated in the position they are playing.
- A coach may request a player to switch positions for a tryout session.

This process is in place to ensure a fair, transparent, and consistent evaluation for all players participating in competitive team tryouts within the Nepean Ringette Association.
